I've been trying to spend more time doing some reading as of late. I really enjoy reading. Finding the time to do it is the challenge. Most of the reading that I do these days is online or with eBooks. I came across this article via Google News and thought I would share it with you. It echos a particular point from my March 17<sup>th</sup> sermon.

Each person on this earth who is created in the image and likeness of God, possesses unique gifts that are to be used to further the Kingdom of God. The danger for all of us is to rely too heavily on our own worth or abilities rather than a dependence on and gratitude to God for those gifts. For instance, St. Philip Neri knew that a beautiful sermon and the gift of Homiletics could come with pride and an over-dependence on one's own insight or intellectual capacity. In order to save [a particular priest with a great pulpit presence from pride], St. Philip taught him that his gifts in writing and delivering sermons rested with God [to that end Philip instructed him to preach the same sermon over and over again to his church.] It is amusing to think of this priest giving the same Homily "six times in a row", as the parishioners looked on in confusion, or even perhaps, boredom. Whether we are able to write, sing, build, paint, sculpt, deliver speeches, study, or do any other manner of things, we must remember that God has given us those gifts in His service and not our own. Pride in our own abilities often blinds us to the mission God has given us and can impede our journey to sainthood (From "St. Philip Neri: The Humorous Side of Humility" by Constance T. Hull, The Catholic Exchange (except for the material included in the brackets []).

Catherine, writing from a Catholic perspective, did a very good job covering spiritual gifts. Her words spoke to me, and perhaps they speak to each of us as we continue to build the kingdom of God together through the "team" approach to ministry at First United Methodist Church.

The Apostle Paul wrote about spiritual gifts in Romans 12, Ephesians 4 and I Corinthians 12. He concludes by sharing in I Corinthians 14:12: "Since you are eager for gifts of the Spirit, try to excel in those that build up the church." I would encourage you to read these passages, seek the gifts of the spirit, and strive to build up one another as you exercise your gift in humility. Amen!

Wonderful things are going on in the Music Ministry.

ConwayRingers rang in worship two Sundays in March, and we are looking to Palm Sunday, and the celebratory music of Easter. April is ConwayRingers' anniversary month - in 2005, we reorganized and began those rehearsals with twelve people. Fifteen folks currently are involved.

The Chancel Choir is also rehearsing music for Palm Sunday and Easter. Anthems will involve soloists, and a narrator. The first hymn is a raise-the-roof arrangement of "Christ the Lord is Risen Today"; it is part of the tradition of the past several years. The Chancel Choir will also sing during the Maundy Thursday service.

The new sound/video components are on track for installation in April. I am proud to announce that the Music Ministries contributed the full amount of the quote for installing acoustic panels in the sanctuary and overflow - just over 7000.00. These monies have come from the designated offerings over the past several years, both from our congregation, and from folks who have connections with our music ministry in various ways. When these monies have come to us, they have been given in anonymity; it has never been possible to thank anyone personally. We remain ever grateful for the ways that you encourage, and it is our prayer that we are good, faithful, responsible stewards of your generosity to us.

Finally, I am planning my retirement from the music responsibilities, on September 1, 2019. I began playing full-time in 1985. When I was in high school, I played in the summer months for Carrie Virginia Lantz so that she could have some time off. However, the real beginning of my musical involvement at this church began in 1958 in Anna Calain's piano recitals. I was four years old.

There is a history of musical excellence here at First Church Elkins. My hope, always, is that we have never ever lost sight of the reason why that is true. We musical folks always seek ways to offer our gifts back to God, the Supreme Giver. Music has the mysterious ability to reach into the heights of joy or the depths of grief, when words alone fall short. Without exception, each person who rings and sings has a personal relationship to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The element of faith is always intertwined with music and that is the excellence that is present.

I am grateful for my working time in this congregation. I am grateful most of all for the folks who have stepped into music ministry with full commitment. We are close...closer even than family sometimes. We have remained faithful always to: "What's said in the rehearsal room stays in the rehearsal room." It is our way of honoring concerns by holding them close to our hearts, in thought and prayer.


The Staff-Parish Relations Committee has begun the process of determining the next steps in music ministry leadership. I am honored to have been in this time and place with these ringers and singers. And you.
