From The Pastor's Desk:

Have you ever taken time to walk a Labyrinth?

A labyrinth is a meandering path, often unicursal, with a singular path leading to a center. Labyrinths are an ancient archetype dating back 4,000 years or more, and were used symbolically as a walking meditation or choreographed dance, or as a site of rituals and ceremonies, among other things.

Labyrinths are tools for personal, psychological and spiritual transformation. Walking a Labyrinth can give one a sense of spiritual pilgrimage and religious practice. Walking a Labyrinth can evoke mindfulness as you walk in silent contemplation.

LCHT has a labyrinth behind the Rocking Horse PreSchool outdoor play yard. This labyrinth was created by Eagle Scout Jacob Hoffman in 2020. If you have not taken time to walk the created path, I would encourage you to do so.

My favorite time to walk a labyrinth is on a summer evening as dusk is beginning to fall. And my favorite labyrinth to walk is at Epler's Church behind the cemetery. It was established in the mid-1990's under the tutelage of Rev. Evelyn Aurand.

Many times when I have been puzzling over a problem or just wanting to seek some spiritual contemplation, I have walked the labyrinth. I have also led Labyrinth Walks with visitors, friends, and even confirmands.

Summer is a wonderful time to experience a walk on the labyrinth, and I am encouraging everyone to experience this opportunity sometime in July and August, either at LCHT Labyrinth or the Epler's Church Labyrinth.

Guest walkers are welcome at Epler's Labyrinth, and there is a guest book to sign if you choose in the stand that is nearby. The labyrinth area there is quiet, and frequently you may observe some wildlife as you take your walk.

I pray that you will have an opportunity to walk a labyrinth this summer. I would enjoy hearing from you about your experience if you do.





REDNER'S REGISTER TAPES

Redner's Warehouse Markets gives 1% of purchases back to the Women of the ELCA. This one percent can really add up! And the monies go to good things like the Mission Trip, VFW, Berk's Women in Crisis, just to name a few. In order for Redner's to count the receipt (a.k.a. - register tape), it has to be the ENTIRE receipt, and it has to have a "save-a-tape" number on it. Use your pump perks card or save-a-tape card at the check-out. Then, just drop the ENTIRE receipt in the box at the ushers station in the narthex.

DO NOT cut the bottom off. We only get credit for COMPLETE tapes! Also, please be sure to turn your tapes in in a timely manner, as Redner's will not accept any over three years old. Your help is so appreciated. If you have any questions, please see Janet Kleffel.

<u>Veterans Making a Difference</u> is an ongoing project through WELCA and Pastoral Care. There is a box in the narthex for collecting needed items for the veterans. Items will be delivered as they accumulate. Suggestions for items are as follows: Toothpaste (preferably Crest), toothbrushes, mouthwash, deodorant (preferably Old Spice), shampoo, sleep pants (L, XL, XXL), toilet paper, paper towels, laundry detergent, liquid body soap and dish soap.

"GOOD GIFTS" THANK YOU

THANKS and appreciation to all who contributed to the WELCA "Good Gifts" project. Our group was seeking contributions (\$500) to purchase a cow for a family that would supply them with a calcium-packed source of nutrition for their children and to generate income by selling extra milk, cheese, yogurt, butter and more. Many **THANKS** to our congregation, as we exceeded our goal with a total of \$1,670 being collected. With this amount of funds, we were able to purchase the following items: 2 Family farms, 2 roosters, 2 water filter units and 1 latrine. The Family farm consists of a cow, a couple goats, a dozen chicks, two pigs, farming tools, seeds and agricultural training which can create a world of opportunity for a family living in poverty. The roosters were added in order to keep reproduction of chickens going. The two water filters will help provide safe drinking water; it is capable of purifying water without electricity or chemicals. The latrine purchase will provide training to help with maintenance and hygiene and will lead to a much healthier community, not to mention a safer way to take care of business. This latrine purchase will also help with prevention of contamination of the local water supply and food chain; thus preventing far too many people getting sick and preventable diseases.
