LISD Has New Bus Company Operator

You may have noticed that LISD has new buses this year. Thanks to the new contract with First Student, LISD now has 288 brand new buses that all have air conditioning. A new safety feature requires the bus drivers to walk to the back of the bus at the end of the day and push a button in an effort to ensure no students are left on the bus when the driver leaves.

HHS Students Exceed National and State ACT Scores, College Readiness Standards

ACT recently released Lewisville ISD (LISD)'s 2015 ACT data, which included average student scores from all high schools across the district on the college entrance exam. The data reflects an average LISD ACT score of 23.7, a result that exceeds the state and national average scores of 20.9 and 21, respectively.

HHS students tested: 296; Average scores: English - 23.8, Math - 24.5, Reading - 24.5, Science - 23.8, Composite - 24.3

LISD students tested: 1464; Average scores: English - 23.2, Math - 24.5, Reading - 23.8,

Science - 23.4, Composite: 23.7

State students tested: 124,764; Average scores; English - 19.8, Math - 21.1, Reading - 21.1,

Science - 21, Composite: 20.9

Nation students tested: 1,924,436; Average scores; English - 20.4, Math - 20.8, Reading -

21.4, Science - 20.9, Composite: 21

In 2015, the percent of HHS students ready for college-level coursework was 48 percent, as compared to state and national averages of 27 and 28 percent, respectively. According to ACT, this report is an indication of the extent to which students are prepared for college-level work. The ACT consists of curriculum-based exams of educational development in English, mathematics, reading and science designated to measure the skills needed for success in first-year college course work.
