## A Message from Pastor Robert.....

October 31st will mark the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's posting of the 95 thesis. This is considered the symbolic act that sparked the Protestant Reformation, one of the most important periods in the history of the Western world. While we wish to honor this historic event it is important that we do not look at it as a celebration. While it did mark the birth of the Lutheran Church, it was something nobody really wanted to happen. When Martin Luther posted his 95 thesis he had no idea that it would result in the splitting of the church, followed by decades of war throughout Western Europe.

Initially it was hoped that the church leaders would address Martin Luther's grievances and rectify these practices (something they would eventually do decades later, unfortunately by that time the church was so divided that there was no going back). Alas instead of addressing the complaint the church saw it as a threat to their power and decided to fight back with all their might. This response to Martin Luther and the historical drama that would unfold over the next several decades contains several lessons regarding institutionalized religion, politics, and the role media plays in both that still resonate today, and are useful in regards to how we deal with issues regarding those same topics.

Ultimately the narrative of the Reformation period boils down to how different people and groups deal with change, particularly how change effects those in power. When challenged nearly every major character and/or group involved in the shaping of the Reformation acted in ways that made things worse. Emperor Charles the 5th refused to make peace with Protestant nations and instead

promoted violence against them out of fear that it would lessen his power; the pope and his advisors knew that they were abusing their power yet refused to back down out of fear that it would make them look weak; and Martin Luther over the years became so convinced that he was right that he refused to make any compromises out of fear that it would jeopardize his reputation.

Each of these groups allowed fear to govern their actions rather than love. In 1530 Martin Luther sat down with other Protestant leaders in order to join their movements together. Martin Luther's fear that he might be wrong led them to leave the table permanently divided and it was over just one point out of fifteen, a point that Luther's opponents were willing to overlook in the interests of unity. This would mark the beginning of the divide between the Lutheran and Reformed traditions in the Lutheran Church.

This reminds us that when we act out of fear rather than love we end up divided. True power comes from the heart when people learn to work together rather than only worrying about their own self interests. In the 1500s if more people had been willing to work together our modern world would have looked a lot different, and if we are willing to work together now our world could look a lot better moving forward.

*"Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else." 1 Thessalonians 5:15*


**Crafters:** Are responsible for bringing their crafts to church, setting up their display and taking it down. We will furnish tables and tablecloths. Crafters do not need to be present during the sale unless they wish to stay with their crafts or help out. (Help is always welcome.) You must leave a phone number where we can reach you the day of the sale. The crafter does not have to be a member of Burke.

Crafters must tag each item with a removable tag that is at least one inch by one inch and includes your initials and price. (This tag will be removed when the item is sold and returned with your money.) The church will keep 20% of your sold items, unless you wish to donate more. If the item is totally donated, write "donated" on the tag. We ask that you do not bring commercial products to sell. The church will be open on Friday evening, November 10th, 4:00pm-7:00pm for you to set up your crafts. 20% of the money raised from the craft items sold will go to the "move the church" fund.

There will be one check-out and anyone paying by check will make it payable to Burke Lutheran Church. You will not be handling money at your display. Crafters will need to come back at 4:00pm to take down their displays. We will have your money and tags ready for you to pick up at the church office on Monday, November 13th from 2pm-4pm. Please contact the church office, at 244-8486, if this time doesn't work for you.

**Bakers:** We are in need of your delicious home-made bakery goods. 100% of the money raised from the baked goods will go to the "move the church" fund. The church will be open on Friday evening from 4pm-7pm for you to drop off your baked goods, or you can stop by early Saturday morning. We ask that you do not price them as we will do it to keep like items priced the same. We will also be selling lefse. Any baked items that do not sell on Saturday will be sold Sunday morning after church services. Thank you in advance for participating!
