Fort Langley Community Rowing Club Boat Storage Policy

- 1. FLCRC has two singles racks (maximum six shells each rack) available from Bedford Channel Society in the "upper storage".
- 2. Overall storage priority will always be given to Club boats, however one singles rack (six shells) has been designated for members in good standing to store privately owned rowing shells.
- **3.** The Directors shall review the needs for Club boats each year to determine the total availability of rack space for private boats.
- **4.** Only bona-fide rowing shells may be stored. Canoes, kayaks, dinghies, dories, paddle-boards, etc. may not be stored.
- 5. Private shells may be stored only by members in good standing at all times of the period in which a boat is stored. (membership year is April 1 March 31)
- 6. The term for Boat Storage is twelve months ending December 31 of each year, in concert with the dates of the storage space leases with Bedford Channel Society for all storage space. Members must apply to renew their boat storage agreement each year.
- **7.** Boat Storage Fees are currently set at \$250.00 per year, payable at the earlier of January 1 or the date that the boat is stored.
- **8.** When space is available, month-to month storage may be made available for \$40 per calendar month, payable in advance. (March 2015)
- **9.** On an individual basis, fees may be negotiated between boat owner and club executive in consideration of factors such as availability for Club use.
- **10.** Requests for storage and storage renewals must be made in writing each year and forwarded to the attention of the Club Secretary by November 1 for the upcoming year.
- **11.** In the event that there are more requests for space than the space available, a determination of which boats will be given space will be made by the Directors. Directors in a conflict of interest shall abstain from voting. Typically allocations will be made on the basis of:
 - a. Previous boat storage
 - b. Frequency of use
 - c. Frequency of competition representing the Club
 - d. Special needs that render the available Club boats unsuitable
 - e. Membership duration and contribution to the club
 - f. Willingness to allow other Club members to use the stored equipment
- **12.** All privately owned equipment is stored at the sole risk of the owner. The Club does not assume responsibility for damage, loss or theft of members' equipment stored at the club however caused. It is the responsibility of the member to obtain the appropriate insurance protection for their shell and for any damage caused in connection with that shell.
- **13.** Boat Storage racks may not be sub-let out or loaned to another member. Only the member that was originally assigned rack space may use that rack.
- **14.** Shells stored at the Club must be in regular use. A shell that is not in regular use is subject to review by the Club Executive and the owner may be required to vacate the assigned space.
- 15. Owners who have been notified that their privately-owned oars, shell and any other equipment must be removed from Club have thirty days from the date of notification to remove same. Equipment that has not been removed within that time frame will be considered abandoned and will be assumed to have been donated to the Club.

Acceptance of these Terms and Conditions in full is a prerequisite for the granting or continuance of storage rights. Owners agree to abide by these and all Club safety rules and guidelines.
