

Presence in Forgiveness!

With Pastor Eric

²⁰For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

²¹Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" ²²Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but I tell you, seventy-seven times. **Matthew 18:20-22.** (note for the <u>same</u> sin on the <u>same</u> day)

Do you remember the children's message on the Sunday before the Derecho storm hit?

Nels asked us to share about the worst storm that we had ever experienced. The days following the "surprise storm" were a series of tree-strewn nightmares without power and the incessant sounds of chainsaws and generators. I visited all around the community that week and appreciated time with many of you as we together dragged limbs and took pictures for insurance providers. A "running joke" of the week was the reference to Nel's question about the worst storm that we have ever experienced.

I have to share with you that as bad as this storm was with tree damage and extensive damage to the church and crops in the area. I have seen a great deal of "God among us" and I hope that you have glimpsed God as well. People sharing from the depleted food stocks before they go bad. People sharing generator plugs or freezer space or hot water. People roaming the street like a wave of chainsaw wielding yard cleaners just serving other's in need. We can get along without a whole lot of modern conveniences better than we think but we simply cannot get along well without one another! If there is a storm, then it's not winds and rain but isolation due to pandemic and lack of communications which lack of electrical power can aggravate.

Because we need one another to live healthy lives in dire times, I find myself concerned with how we treat each other when we do get a chance to be together whether for help, worship, or service. Right now, we are grieving and afraid which can easily cause us to be suspicious and insecure. Our world is changing, and our daily routines are uncomfortable and unfamiliar, like pushing a square peg through a round hole – it eventually fits but painful and damaged. This storm is more threatening than any wind or rain system. Together we can rebuild roofs and restock refrigerators, replace electrical devices, clear trees and plant more crops but rebuilding relationships and managing a unified support system is so much harder!

Jesus realizes that community is essential especially during crisis. We need one another to get through life and thrive. We have a tremendous gift in Christ Jesus which we call forgiveness. We are expected to forgive as we have been forgiven. This article is meant to remind us that we are all vulnerable and hurting people who have the same weakness and sin. God's love for us in Jesus has blessed us with a way of staying together even when we are wronged or slighted by a hurting neighbor. It is not about being "right," or "hurting back," or "ignoring," but it is about listening, giving people the benefit of the doubt and finding a way to help, heal and work together. If forgiveness were a super-power, then we would have a tougher skin and a softer heart towards others who hurt and bleed like we do. Let us pray. Gracious God, whose forgiveness is grace in every way, thank you for sending us Jesus to teach us about and demonstrate the gift of forgiveness. Thank you for the ultimate forgiveness given to us in Jesus's death and resurrection. Grant us tougher skins and softer hearts as we face a new season of pandemic, weather crisis and changes in our daily lives, so that we might grow closer together in support and love in Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen.



Palestine Lutheran Church – Daily Prayer during Rebuilding and Recovery from the Derecho Storm and COVID-19 Community Response

<u>Psalm 46</u> – David is under attack, pursued by Saul, he takes refuge in the caves of the Negev. He is alone in this wilderness with his own people turned against him and fleeing death itself. And so, he prays to God in the midst of the darkness. This psalm (prayer) became the inspiration for Martin Luther's majestic hymn "A Mighty Fortress" which spearheaded the German protestant reformation and the great schisms of the 16th and 17th centuries. Now it becomes our prayer once more as we face new and imminent battles of social changes and disruption to life in schools and homes.

(Please use as a daily devotional prayer and as a guide for prayer time along with the Lord's Prayer)

²*Therefore we will <u>not</u> fear*, though the earth should change,

though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; ³though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

⁵God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved;
<u>God will help it when the morning dawns</u>.
⁶The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts.
<u>7The LORD of hosts is with us;</u>
<u>the God of Jacob is our refuge.</u>
<u>8</u>Come, behold the works of the LORD; see what desolations he has brought on the earth.
⁹He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.
<u>10"Be still, and know that I am God!</u>

I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth." ¹¹The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.



Summary of the 2020 Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly

The 33nd Assembly of the Southeastern Iowa Synod was held on August 5th and 7th online. Nearly 400 voting members and visitors gathered virtually around the theme "With a New Song." Videoconferencing was used for voting members and visitors were able to view a livestream of the event.

The assembly convened on Wednesday, August 5th. Business included the approval of the 2021 synod budget and the report of the nominating committee. This session also included the first (nominating ballot) for the election of bishop. The assembly was then recessed until Friday, August 7th.

The assembly reconvened on the morning of August 7th. Sara Hegg-Dunne was elected as the new synod vice-president. Several synod council positions were elected, and elections were held for synod nominating, discipline, and consultation committees. A full report of those elections can be found on the assembly webpage.

The assembly also cast a second ballot for the election of bishop which included the names of 21 ministers of word and sacrament. After the second ballot, the top eight vote-getters addressed the assembly. These nominees were; Erika Uthe, Ken Sundet Jones, Amy Current, Dan Kuckuck, Timothy Olson, Katie Lowe-Lancaster, Jennifer Thomas, and Jayne Thompson.

A third ballot was cast and with no election, the top three candidates –Erika Uthe, Amy Current, and Timothy Olson—moved on to the fourth ballot. These three candidates had the opportunity to answer questions provided by the Bishop's Election Committee. No election on the fourth ballot meant the top two vote-getters, Erika Uthe and Amy Current moved on the fifth ballot.

The Rev. Amy Current was elected on the fifth ballot, with 178 votes. The Rev. Erika Uthe received 173 votes. The bishop-elect Amy Current is currently serving as Vice President of Admissions and Student Services at Wartburg Seminary. She graduated from Concordia College, Moorhead, MN, and received an M. Div from Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque, IA and was ordained on July 13, 1997.

The Synod Assembly offering was designated for the ELCA's International Women Leaders program, which provides support and empowerment to international women leaders in the life and development of church and society. Additionally, a courtesy resolution of thanksgiving for the assembly and various ministries of the Southeastern Iowa Synod is available online.


