DISCUSSION	Mike Reed and Mike Janicek presented information based on “Alcohol Related Crashes and Fatality GIS Mapping – 2011 to present”. See charts
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DISCUSSION	<p>Presented the issues facing Colorado with the legalization of marijuana</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gather information related to drug impaired driving • Eatables and the ability of chemists expertise to grow a hybrid plant with a high THC was not anticipated • Collection of data is imperative with complete analysis • Assume that it could become legalized and become educated and proactive • Monitoring – develop baselines • DRE will be a base requirement for law enforcement officers in the future – Chief Hernandez goal to get all Colorado patrolman DRE certified • Animal poisonings have increased • Public education is necessary
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DISCUSSION	<p>Jonlee shared that data was the discussion point of the last subcommittee meeting in July. Ernie is enhancing his data collection forms to include more drugged driving data collection, Mike Janicek will start using his data resources as a collection point and develop a report, and Ashley Schluck will begin working with the courts.</p> <p>Basic SFST training will be reinstated at WLEA to include all training components. Develop some independent study tracks for WLEA students to enhance their abilities and education.</p>
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DISCUSSION	<p>Add a consensual oral fluid swab test to the field testing in the following counties to start gathering the data related to drugged driving. Albany and Laramie County would be the pilot counties to start participating in the project. Cost for instruments at the detention centers – Draeger cost of (2) \$10,000 – swabs - \$20,000. To include validating the data at a testing center could go above \$100,000.00 in cost. Equipment and training would be part of the pilot project to begin the data gathering process.</p> <p>Motion to purchase Draeger testing equipment for pilot projects in the following counties; Albany and Laramie County detention centers at the cost of \$10,000 using this fiscal year’s funding by Tom Loftin, 2nd by Dawn Sides, majority vote yes, Mike Cornell and Kelli Perotti abstain.</p>
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DISCUSSION	<p>Gary Way provided handouts (loaded to website) and provided the background and concerns related to the DUI legislation. Health care professionals are refusing to do forcible blood draws within all but three counties. Many states are charging under statute that a refusal is a separate charge. Prosecutors have been discussing the DUI statutes to include the Interlock system – refusal issue. Issues were presented at the 2014 Legislature looking to future sessions to move the issue forward.</p>
