



EARN HER TRUST

Ninety per cent of women prefer a long-term partner who earned his cash, rather than inherited it, reports a multi-centre US and Australian study. **"Women associate self-earned wealth with reliability, self-sufficiency and intelligence,"** says study author Dr Peter Jonason, from the University of Western Sydney. If you have family money, play up your generosity – say, by donating to charity – which shows you don't take your wealth for granted.

RUN A SMELL CHECK

The funky fumes emanating from your pits sending the girls running? You might need more than a stronger deodorant. Body odour can signal the presence of an STI, say Russian researchers at the Institute of Cytology and Genetics. They found that women are more likely to describe a man's sweat as "putrid" if he's infected with gonorrhoea. Why the pong? Your immune system may produce odiferous compounds in response to the invading bacteria, says study author Dr Mikhail Moshkin.

Male Pattern Badness

Was your father a philanderer? That could be bad news for your relationship. You may be at greater risk of straying if your dad did, suggests a survey of 88 long-term couples by Prague's Charles University. But the results showed no link between parental infidelity and the risk of your girl cheating. The reason? "Men's sexuality may be shaped during childhood more so than women's," says study author Dr Jan Havlicek. "Women's infidelity is predicted more by the quality of their current relationship."
