

Ninety per cent of women prefer a long-term partner who earned his cash, rather than inherited it, reports a multi-centre US and Australian study. "Women associate self-earned wealth with reliability, self-sufficiency and intelligence," says study author Dr Peter Jonason, from the University of Western Sydney. If

Body odour can signal the presence of an STI, say Russian researchers at the Institute of Cytology and Genetics.
