Sunday Reflection: The Baptism of the Lord

Why did Jesus, the Sinless One, submit himself to John's baptism? In this humble submission we see a foreshadowing of the "baptism" of his bloody death upon the cross. Jesus' baptism is the acceptance and the beginning of his mission as God's suffering Servant. He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners. Jesus submitted himself entirely to his Father's will. Out of love he consented to this baptism of death for the

remission of our sins. The Father proclaimed his entire delight in his Son and spoke audibly for all to hear. The Holy Spirit, too, was present as he anointed Jesus for his ministry which began that day as he rose from the waters of the Jordan river. Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all who come to believe in him. At his baptism the heavens were opened and the waters were sanctified by the descent of the Holy Spirit, signifying the beginning of a new creation.

How can we enter into the mystery of Jesus' humble self-abasement and baptism? Gregory of Nazianzus (329-389 AD), an early church father tells us: "Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him." Do we want to see our life transformed in the likeness of Christ? And do we want to become a more effective instrument of the Gospel? Examine Jesus' humility and ask the Holy Spirit to forge this same attitude in our heart. Jesus is ever ready to renew and refashion us in his likeness through the gift and working of the Holy Spirit. Ask the Lord Jesus to fill us with his Holy Spirit that we may radiate the joy of the Gospel to those around us.

Saint of the Week ... St. Anthony of Egypt

St. Anthony of Egypt, also known as St. Anthony the Great, was born in Egypt in 251 to a wealthy family. From an early age he showed no interest in the luxury of worldly life, and at age 20 when his parents died, he gave all of his inheritance to the poor and began his life as a hermit. At age 35 he moved to the desert and lived for 20 years in an abandoned fort.

Although most of Anthony's life was spent in solitude, no saint is antisocial. Anthony drew many people to him for spiritual healing and guidance. Word about him spread, and so many disciples arrived that Anthony founded two monasteries on the Nile. Descriptions paint him as modest and courteous. His example led many to take up the monastic life, which led to him being known as the founder of organized Christian monasticism.



Feast Day: January 17

Anthony is often pictured with a T-shaped cross, a pig and a book. The pig and the cross are symbols of his valiant warfare with the devil: the cross his constant means of power over evil spirits; the pig a symbol of the devil himself. The book recalls his preference for the book of nature over the printed word.

Anthony died at the age of 105. He is the patron saint of butchers, gravediggers and skin diseases. *Sources: franciscanmedia.org and catholicsaints.info*
