Houston homes sales showed no letup in July, but the pace was not enough to rival record-setting volume and pricing set in June. Inventory remained constrained at a 4.2-months' supply. Consumers are keeping the Houston housing market one of the most vibrant in the U.S., despite low inventory and concerns of affordability. Lakewood Forest continues to improve the sales price per square foot, over last year, while persisting to cycle flooded inventory and still providing a lot of home for the money along with low HOA maintenance fees.

## **Get ACC Approval Before Building!**

Lakewood Forest is a Deed Restricted community. The Fund's Architectural Control Committee (ACC) must approve all exterior remodeling and building projects before the project begins. The Fund has the necessary legal authority to enforce this rule.





Web Editor and Yearbook chair, Adrienne Iuno, had managed to get both our yearbooks and a new website updated. A big task well done!








Birthdays for summer and September were celebrated complete with candles. Happy birthday many times over, dear ladies!





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# Nard of the Month

## Judging for November to be done the last week of October in Sections 1 and 7.

Once a yard has received the "Yard of the Month" award, it is not eligible for further awards for one year. The first place winner for each month will receive a \$50 gift certificate from Plants for All Seasons and recognition in the next *Civic News*. An honorable mention yard will receive a \$25 gift certificate from Plants for All Seasons. Yards are judged in March, April, May, June, October, and November.

Judging is done by members of the garden club on a rotating basis, using the subdivision sections as listed in the Lakewood Forest Directory. It is usually done the last week of the previous month; i.e., judging for October would be held the last week of September.

## **Public Service Voter Information**

#### **For Lakewood Forest Residents**

The General Election of 2018 will be held on **Tuesday, November 6.** America is blessed to have a democratic republic that allows its citizens to elect their representatives. We can have a republic of the people, by the people and for the people only if we participate in the election process. Texas voters will select from a long list of contested races including US Senator, every US Congressional Representative, State-wide races including Governor and other state executive offices, Railroad Commissioner, State Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals judges, State Senator and Representative, judicial positions for the First Court of Appeals, District Courts, Family District Courts, county officials, and county judicial positions for civil courts, criminal courts, constables and justices of the peace. There are 76 judicial races on the ballot.

Every citizen has an obligation and a duty to be informed and participate in the election process. This election could be the most important in your lifetime to choose who controls the reins of government at the federal, state, and county level.

If you are not registered to vote, obtain a voter's registration application and register to vote 30 days before the election. The last day to register to vote is October 9. Don't wait until the last day to register because additional identification may be required. Obtain a voter registration application from

the Harris County Voter Registrar at 713-368-VOTE (8683) or online at https://www.hctax.net/Voter/Registration.

You must be a US citizen to register to vote. You must be at least 17 years and 10 months old to register. Your voter registration will become effective 30 days after it is received or on your 18th birthday, whichever is later. If you move to another county, you must re-register in the county of your new residence. To vote, you must be a resident of Harris County, not a felon, and have not been declared mentally incompetent by a court of law.

You must be registered to be eligible to vote. Registered voters are issued Voter Registration Certificates. The current Voter Registration Certificate has a yellow background. Bring your Voter Registration Certificate when you come to vote, although an authorized photographic identification card is required.

It is recommended to vote early in person or by mail. To vote early in person, appear in person at any Early Voting Location with your Voter Registration Certificate and photo I.D. during the early voting dates, October 22 to November 2. You may vote early at Prairie View A&M College, 9449 Grant Road, or at other early voting locations listed online at http://www.harrisvotes.com/EarlyVoting/

To obtain a ballot by mail, contact the County Clerk at 713-755-6965 or online at www.harrisvotes.com before October 26. However, if you request a ballot by mail, then decide to vote in person, you must give the unused mail ballot to the Election Judge to be allowed to vote in person.

To vote on Election Day, you must vote at your precinct location with a photo I.D. Your precinct number is on your Voter Registration Certificate. Check with the County Clerk on www.harrisvotes.com or the Houston Chronicle newspaper on Election Day for your voting location.




