Although this workshop is offered both virtually and in-person, we encourage teachers who can to attend in person for a more engaging experience and a chance to explore the exhibitions with museum staff. There will also be time to discuss how we can create a meaningful gallery visit for your students. Additionally, attendees will be awarded NYS Education Department Continuing Teacher and Leader Education Professional Development Credits.
