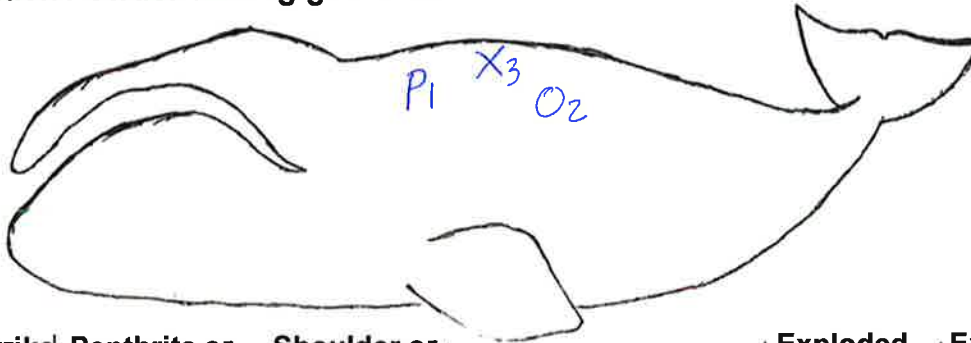

Good conditions. Light winds. Small swells with no breakers. We were able to see blows from 1/2 mile away. Lots of shearwaters near where whale was caught.
