

Christ's Peace Is Lasting

One of my favourite prayers that I love to say at the end of each day is "Our heart is restless until it rests in you." This is the famous passage from St. Augustine's Confessions in which he states "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." With gratitude to Saint Augustine, I find his prayer has a great impact on my spiritual life. in this prayer we recognize God as the author of our life and the purpose of our life lies in Him alone. The prayer also recognizes our deepest longing to be with God who not only saves us but also gives us long lasting peace. This is particularly important as our daily life faces many unrests, such as health unrest, economic unrest and social unrest.

Jesus, I believe, knows our need and desire very well. That's why at the Last Super He told His Apostles: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." But what does He mean by peace? He said: "Not as the world gives do I give it to you." With these words Jesus is telling us that there is difference between the peace given by Him and the one given by the world. What is the difference? The world given peace is depending mostly on the circumstances and world's standards. Life is at peace when everything goes well and there are no problems to deal with. Peace, according to the world's standards, means the absence of any problems, disturbances, or inconveniences. This is what you might call a superficial or outer peace.

The peace given by Jesus, on the other hand, doesn't depend on circumstances of life. It can even flow in the midst of persecution, trouble, disappointment, confusion, and anxiety. Take for instance, the Vietnamese Cardinal Joseph Xavier van Thuan, the Archbishop of Saigon, who died in Rome, exiled from his homeland. He was arrested by the Communist authorities and jailed for 13 years. Nine of those years were spent in solitary confinement, in gruesome conditions and horrible privations. Despite all these hardships Cardinal Van Thuan was very much in peace with his life. He even successfully shared his faith with young soldiers and converted them into Christianity.

I believe that's the kind of inner strength and peace of mind that Christ wants to give us. It is the peace that comes from knowing without any doubt whatsoever that we are loved by Him. It is the peace that comes from knowing without any doubt whatsoever that whenever we offend Him, he will always be ready to forgive us. It is the peace that comes from knowing without any doubt whatsoever that we have a purpose in life, a mission - the very mission that Christ Himself has given us: to spread His Kingdom. As today's Psalm puts it, to "make his way known upon earth; among all nations, his salvation". Only because Christ has given us this peace, by giving us faith in His love, mercy, and mission, He can command us: "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."

When our peace is based on anything else, other than Christ, such as popularity, wealth, comfort, or power, I believe, it would be unstable. It won't last longer because all those things are temporal and vulnerable to change. But Christ's peace isn't vulnerable, because it's based on His love, mercy, and mission, and those are

everlasting. Let us continue to pray for Christ's lasting peace and be makers of this peace.

Acts 15:1-2,22-29

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us; and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we

are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols; from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.
