## Neighborhood Meetings Guest Speakers

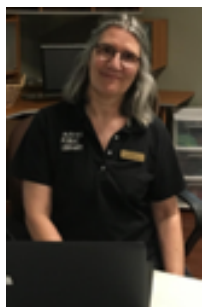
We only have two neighborhood meetings left, before the summer break.

## Garden Calendar — April

Warm weather and spring rains are in the forecast!

- Prune spring-flowering shrubs and trees after they bloom.
- Prune climbing roses and other “once bloomers” as soon as they finish flowering
- Thin peaches, apples, and pears
- Mulch trees, shrubs, vegetables, and flower beds with 2–4 inches of mulch
- Fertilize tomatoes and peppers
- Plant beans, corn, cucumbers, eggplant, okra, peanuts, peppers, pumpkins, squash, sweet potato, tomato transplants, and watermelons

You may call 311 to report homeless activities in the lots, greenbelts and creek areas around the neighborhood.

## Does Speed Matter? You Bet Your Life It Does!



Seventy people are killed in wrecks in an average year in Austin, and many more are hurt. Speeding is a factor in almost a third of crashes, and pedestrians are most at risk. Higher speeds boost the risk that a pedestrian will be killed or hurt in a wreck.

A recent city speed study on Coronado Hills Drive found that cars were going an average speed of 39 miles per hour, well above the speed limit. Slowing down a little will hardly make a difference travel time, but it could save a life.
