Pastor's thoughts ...

Hello St. Mark's Lutheran,

Grace and Peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and welcome to another month held gently in the loving arms of God. It has been a wonderful couple of days here in the middle of May as we approach the coming of June. For now it's Pentecost. Pentecost, that time for celebration, that time we remember the birth of the church. At Pentecost we remember when people from different backgrounds, races, societies, and speaking different languages came together and were made part of an amazing event. At Pentecost the church sprung forth through the **explosive** power of the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire, gifting the people the ability to talk to each other. And in the midst of the confusion, Peter shared with them all about what Jesus had proclaimed: forgiveness, hope, loving for our neighbors and enemies, resurrection and new life through Christ, and that after Jesus ascended again to heaven he would send an Advocate for them all. This time of Pentecost/after Pentecost is important in that we are still encouraged to share the words and promises of Jesus Christ with those around us.

Now that sounds great! How do we do that? I had a conversation recently in which I had detailed the many things I had going on. My friend said "busy with work, family, and friends... sounds like a great life". Well yes I suppose. I've preached on the danger before of letting busyness become the sign of our success or putting it slightly differently that in our society when we are busy it is accounted as successful. But, and perhaps this is like you too, when I am truly busy I long for relaxation/rejuvenation. When I'm not very busy I seek out things to do. When I am stressed and exhausted I seek entertainment, because it feels easier than better forms of stress relief like exercise for example (exercise is truly important for your physical and mental health).

WHAT'S YOUR POINT PASTOR? When my friend extolled the virtue of my great busy life some things were left out. What about me? What about God? Taking care of our own health and wellbeing is important because if we don't our care for ourselves who will? If I'm unhealthy I can't give as much in my work or with my family and friends. And if we don't **MAKE** time for God (<u>bible reading, study, prayer, worship,</u> <u>discussions with friends/family</u>) not only does it diminish our own life (mental, emotional health) it shows the world that our priorities are not of God.

But pastor the church doesn't have a bible study right now! So start one!

I don't really know how or what to pray? Spend some time in your bible, find a devotional that speaks to you... or start a prayer study in which you look at different ways people engage in prayer across the years and even theologies. We can learn a lot from our history and even different traditions.

Be an advocate from/for Christ in the world! Because if we do not who will? No one will do that joyous work for us. Bring God more into your daily life... pray before meals wherever you are. Do not be ashamed of praying out loud in public. Jesus says in Matthew 10:32-33 ³² "Everyone, therefore, who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven, ³³ but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven." Pray with friends who are facing: challenges, defeats, heartbreak, good news, new opportunities. We all need prayers and praying for a friend is honestly awesome. Ask God for forgiveness. You know you did that thing, ask for forgiveness. Ask God for help and guidance. You need it and so do I, don't be ashamed to ask God for guidance. Incorporate the words God Bless you into your daily vernacular (someone helps you out "God Bless You"). Before you know it you'll be blessing everyone.

SO put God first through bible study, devotions, worship, and prayer. Really. Making time for God centered activities in essential. Take care of yourself... exercise, eat right, get enough sleep (you are God's awesome creation you deserve it). Then Make time for family, friends, and do good work. And remember... God loves you, and so do I.
