The Coastside Emergency Corps (CEC) was reestablished in late 2017, with an Interim Board appointed for 2018. The main responsibilities of the Interim Board were to **reorganize the** 501(3)c after having been in limbo for a little over a year, and to work toward the vision of our Mission Statement.

How do we do that?

Connections – build connections within the community through outreach and public events

Communications – open and maintain lines of communications with all agencies involved in emergency response

Protocols — establish protocols related to volunteer training and activation

Training — determine where more training and organization are needed, and provide co-training opportunities for volunteer groups

The mission of the CEC is to provide support to the many volunteer organizations in the San Mateo County Coastside area by bringing them together for integrated training and information sharing such that in the case of an emergency, these organizations will be able to work together in a productive and effective manner in providing assistance to our first responders.
