CLERGY COLUMN

Merry Christmas, everyone!

Another great year in the books! Between our three parishes we had some great celebrations over the past year, including three high school students receiving the sacrament of Confirmation, six elementary students receiving their first Reconciliation and first Communion, two weddings, three baptisms, a very long sermon series about the Kerygma (Lent/Easter), a shorter sermon series about the Eucharist (October), and some other exciting things. Of course, we had a few funerals, too, and continued to pray for the faithful departed. We also saw our overall Mass attendance increase for the second consecutive year - good news!

I'm excited to tell you about a sermon series coming up in just a couple of weeks. Each year there is a little chunk of Ordinary Time between the Christmas season and Lent, and this year I felt inspired to take the five Sundays and use them for a sermon series on the State of the Church. We all know about the State of the Union Address given by the President most years, intended to speak about the current condition of the United States (whether this ends up being the final focus of the Address is a separate topic that isn't going to be addressed in this bulletin article). I am hoping this series will be a time for us to take a look at the Catholic Church around the country and around the world, to get a good look at the past, current, and future state of affairs.

Maybe this series is inspired by the upcoming election (surely a time when many people will be "on edge" this Fall), maybe it's simply that I see a few different things happening in the Church that deserve our attention, or maybe the Lord inspired me for various reasons - whatever the reason, I hope these five weeks can be a time for us to grow in our understanding of the universality of the Catholic Church. The Church is certainly not limited to just our three little towns or even to our little diocese in northwestern Minnesota, but it expands throughout our country and our world. Sometimes we can get so wrapped up into our own parishes that we might lose sight of the bigger picture, a picture which is sometimes very bright and other times a bit dark. To be sure, some parts of this series will be a bit uncomfortable and unpleasant for all of us because there are real struggles and failures that need to be addressed. I'll always make sure to use appropriate language for the sake of little ears in our congregations, even while mentioning some very difficult things to mention. There will also be, I hope, some pleasant things to share about the current state of the Church, which may provide us with encouragement, hope, and determination for the future.

The series will begin on Sunday, January 14th, and will continue for five Sundays - leading right up to Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent. While the series is still a work in progress, I anticipate not preaching about the Scripture readings during Mass. I'd invite you to check out my Bible Study that I post on YouTube each week, focusing on and explaining the Sunday readings.
