On Saturday, April 10th, 9:00 AM, a small work party consisting of: Craig Sheridan, Curt Duesterhoeft, Bill Duffee, Bill Werner, Duane Bunton, Gene Clifton, Steve Kindell and Wayne Orrison did some sorting of equipment, old paperwork and old kitchen supplies from decades of collecting and created 4 piles of "treasure." One pile was trash/burn, another was stuff to sell at Little Hershey, another was stuff to donate and the last was stuff put back in the shed to evaluate later. All in all, we completed the task in about an hour and got most of it done before the rain started. A good job, but one we will have to complete when the weather is nicer. A big thank you to the first effort. It has been a long time coming and we made a good dent in the "stuff" and have some ideas now about how to deal with what remains.

THE ALLEN J LYNCH MEDAL OF HONOR VETERANS FOUNDATION

The event is held at the Aurora Sportsman'c Club facility in Waterman IL. This is an "open to the public" event at a normally private shooting facility. Registration is \$30.00; and can easily be made in advance at: https://ailynchfoundation.org/

Some of the stages available are as follows:

Military color guard for "Flags Up" ceremony ~ 9:45 AM)

Practical rifle, rifle only (move and shoot, your weapon your ammo)

Practical rifle, rifle or handgun (move and shoot, your weapon your ammo)

Practical rifle, handgun only (move and shoot, your weapon your ammo)

Suppressed Stage (opportunity to fire suppressed weapons. (weapons provided, you must purchase subsonic ammo at the event)

50 Cal Sniper rifle (\$5.00 per round; ammo and rifle provided)

Gatling Gun (raffle; \$10.00 / ticket, winner drawn after every 10 ticket sales)

Ongoing all day gun raffles (\$10.00 / ticket, winner drawn after 60 tickets sold)

"Bucket" raffles (\$5.00 / ticket)

"Texas Death Star" (large capacity shotgun game; (Quite the CHALLENGE)

Upon conclusion of the shooting events (approx. 3:30 PM), we will lower the flag. The flag that will be flown over the event is certified to have been flown over the US Capital building. The flag and 2 certificates (one form the US Government, one from the foundation certifying that it was flown over the event) and a custom display case housing the flag and both certificates will be live auctioned.

The Allen J. Lynch Legacy Rifle will also be auctioned. The story behind this rifle is pretty interesting. It was donated as a raffle item 5 years ago. The winner of the raffle IMMEDIATELY donated it back to us to be auctioned off again! The high bidder added some modifications, and donated it the following year, and this has been continuing ever since! Think Stanley Cup"; you get to keep it for a year, and we ask that it be donated for the next ears event. You get to keep a custom plaque recognizing your stewardship.

We will also (90% certain) have a Henry commemorative rifle for auction. There will be several pieces of original, unique paintings that were done by a veteran who only paints with a toothpick! The artist will be at the event. We will have several of his "prints" also for sale and he will be hand embellishing these at the event. We will continually be adding activities, and raffle / auction / silent auction items as we get closer. Allen will be available for photos, autographs etc. As we discussed 100% of all funds raised go the veterans and a **Medal of Honor Recipient** will be present.
