## Make a Block for a Friend: Gregg Colson

## Fabric Requirements:

If possible, please use Reproduction or Civil War print fabrics, in any colors.
(3) 4" squares dark print
(3) 4" squares light print (background)
(2) 9 " $\times 1.5$ " strip light print (same as background)
(2) $4.5 " \times 1.5 "$ strip medium print
(1) 9 " $\times 1.5$ " strip medium print
(1) 4.5 " $\times 1.5$ " strip contrasting medium print for the 9 -patch centers

## Make the blocks

1. Layer each light print background 4 " square onto a dark print 4 " square, right sides together. Draw a line diagonally from one corner to another on the back of the light print square. Sew $1 / 4$ " inch away from the line on both sides and then cut on the drawn line. Press open (seam allowances towards the dark fabric) to produce 6 half square triangles. Trim each of them to 3.5 ", including seam allowances.

2. Sew one medium print and two light print 9 " $\times 1.5$ " strips to make a strip as shown. Crosscut the strip set into 6 segments measuring 1.5 " $\times 3.5$ " each, including seam allowances. Press seam allowances towards the center medium print.

3. Sew two matching medium print 4.5 " $\times 1.5$ " strips on either side of the contrasting medium print $4.5 " \times 1.5 "$ " strip to make a strip set as shown. Crosscut the strip set into 3 segments measuring 1.5 " x 3.5 " each, including seam allowances. Press seam allowances away from the center contrasting medium print towards each of the medium print strips.

4. Arrange and sew the $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 3.5^{\prime \prime}$ segments from steps 2 and 3 into rows as shown. Nest the seam allowances and sew the rows together to make a nine-patch unit measuring 3.5" square, including seam allowances. Make a total of 3 nine-patch units.

5. Arrange the units from steps 1 and 4 as shown below. Sew the units into row, then join the rows to make a block measuring 9.5 " square, including seam allowances. Press seams open between the units; press seams open between the rows.
