### Dear Parishioners,

I have never performed a legit miracle but I do remember one time at my first assignment in Maumee performing my first multiplication of the loaves. As we know Jesus had to multiply the fish and loaves when he fed the 5,000 during his ministry. Jesus' work was miraculous ... my multiplication on the other hand consisted of me breaking many consecrated hosts in half and even a few into fourths. I remember during the Our Father prayer at Mass (after the consecration) looking at the crowd and then looking at how many hosts I had consecrated on the altar. I knew by the quick glance that not everyone would receive a whole host. During communion some of the hosts were so small that I had to make a special announcement saying, "Jesus was fully present in every single particle received at this Mass even in the smallest fraction I distributed." After that Mass and the scaring memories of me breaking the host into very small pieces I vowed never to do that again; even if it meant me going back into the sacristy to place more hosts on the altar before I consecrate them at the Eucharistic prayer. Believe me it is a good thing when this happens, because that means more people are at Mass than anticipated in the set up!

I was overjoyed at both Sacred Heart and St. Joseph this past weekend when at each place I had to run back into the sacristy to put out more hosts. The situation of placing more hosts out was practically needed at St. Joseph's 10:30 am Mass on Sunday! It was a joy to place more hosts on the altar at that Mass and have a GREAT attendance at 10:30 Eucharist. But it was not a joy for me when we had to seat people close to one another. I realize that many people probably felt uncomfortable having people seated so closely to them during this Corona Virus pandemic. Though everyone here is so polite and did not complain ... I would like to apologize to anyone who may have felt dangerously close to someone at Mass.

I intend to improve social distancing rules to the best of my ability so I do not put anyone in an uncomfortable position. With that being said I plan on having 10:30 am Mass in the Convocation Center at St. Joseph's beginning August 9th. This will give me a few weeks to properly assess the large crowd for 10:30 am Mass at St. Joseph and allow us to set up the Convocation Center properly for a truly dignified Mass. Stay tuned for updates on how we will handle the large crowds and 10:30 am St. Joseph Sunday Mass in the up and coming weeks. Most importantly if you have any strong thoughts about keeping the 10:30 am Mass in the Church come August 9th please feel free to e-mail me. I may be swayed through our discussion, but I'm quite certain that come August 9th the Convocation Center will be our home for 10:30 am Mass as long as this virus is still seriously threatening our health. It pains me to do this, but I think the St. Joseph Convocation Center is the best place to provide a safe environment. I believe this because we are doing this in an abundance of caution and to make it possible for more people to attend Mass and comply with health officials directions due to the large capacity of the Convocation Center. Whatever is decided in the near future I hope we can all worship together in person and in joy, as we grow in the wisdom and charity of Christ!

Kindly request any minister in the Communion line, holding a pyx and requesting Hosts, to speak with the priest celebrant after Mass in order that he can remind them of this temporary protocol

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is an umbrella term for modern, healthy, scientifically accurate, and reliable methods of family planning. NFP methods are different from and better than artificial contraception because they cooperate with, rather than suppress, a couple's fertility; can be used both to achieve and avoid pregnancy; call for shared responsibility and cooperation by husband and wife; require spousal communication; foster respect for and acceptance of the total person; have no harmful side effects; and are virtually cost free. NFP is unique because it enables its users to work with the body rather than against it. Fertility is viewed as a reality to live, not a problem to be solved.
