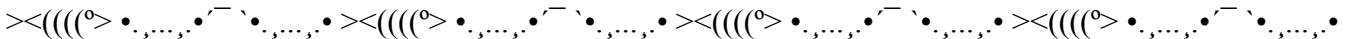

The goal of this award is to honor the memory of Mr. William ( Bill ) O. Hocking, Jr. who was an involved and passionate advocate for the Park and local resources. Bill served as a member of the Citizens Advisory Council for the Park to the State for nearly 40 years since the Park’s creation in 1972 often as the Council’s chairperson. One of Foxborough’s Town Fathers, Bill Hocking was a Conservation Commissioner for nearly 30 years, acting as the Commission’s Chairman from 1983 to 2009. He was a dedicated volunteer, avid outdoorsman, naturalist, mentor, aspiring geologist and mushroom enthusiast, who could often be found “playing” outdoors. Bill often led nature and geology walks to teach adults and children about the great outdoors. He sought to promote conservation efforts in Foxborough through being a long-time contributor to the preparation of the Town’s past and present Open Space Plans. Shortly before his sudden passing on December 28, 2010 Bill received the Outstanding Public Service Award from the Foxboro Rotary Club. Bill’s wisdom and indefatigable presence are greatly missed.
