



Dear Valued Customers,

In order to protect the health and welfare of our employees along with keeping our customers and public safe, effective March 23, 2020 we are temporarily making the following collection changes until further notice. 
Residents:

The Village of Sheridan is planning for this years sidewalk improvements! During the month of May of each year, any landowner desiring financial assistance for repairs or replacement of sidewalk adjacent to their property may make a request for such in writing delivered to the Village Hall. The Street and Alley



Committee shall annually present to the Village Board a resolution containing a sidewalk improvement plan. In selecting sidewalks to be placed on the sidewalk improvement plan, the Street and Alley Committee shall take into consideration the condition of any existing sidewalk, the need for a sidewalk, the expected traffic for the sidewalk, and whether an owner adjoining a sidewalk is willing to participate in a 60%/40% payment agreement where the owner agrees to pay 40% of the cost of sidewalk improvements with the City paying the remaining 60% costs of improvements. If a landowner fails to get a required sidewalk placed on the annual improvement plan, such landowner may repair or install a sidewalk in any street, alley or public ground adjacent to their property but only after approval of the plans and subject to conditions approved by the Street and Alley Committee. Conditions and standards for approval shall be similar to conditions and standards normally undertaken by the Street and Alley Committee for work performed as part of their annual plan for sidewalk improvements.

This can also be viewed in the Village of Sheridan Municipal Code Book on our website-Chapter 9 Sidewalks.

In light of the recent COVID-19 outbreak and current "Shelter in Place" for so many of us, I am donating from my personal supply- 3 boxes of Class 2 face masks (made of thin paper fleece and usually attached behind the ears and rec-

ommended for only a one time use and limited protection) and gloves for our local first responders, senior citizens (age 65 and over) and higher risk Village residents for protection if they may need to go out for groceries, medications, doctor visits, etc. These will be available to those in need at the Sheridan Police Department with a limit of 1 per person.

We are all in this together and we will come out stronger for it.

- 1. Our Free Wi-Fl is on form 9 am till 9 pm, people are welcome to sit outside the library and login into our free Wi-Fi, just link to RWR Library and no password is needed, Also the schools Wi-Fi in available outside the library that is for students to login into, adults cannot access this.
- 2. People can go onto the library facebook pages I am constantly linking free reading resources for kids and adults that they can use all FREE
- 3. I am going to place bins of free books at the post office starting Monday, April 27, there will be 2 bins one for adult reading materials and one for kids, this one will contain bags of books, coloring pages, craft supplies, etc. for kids to use. All the materials are FREE and books do not have to be returned to the library. These books are free form the virus as they have been in our shed for a couple of months now and we would have used them for our books sale but I decided this is a much better use for our community.
- 4. We also have 3 Little Free Libraries, 1 is located outside the Serena Methodist Church, 1 is located behind the Harding Grade School and the 1 is located by the Serena Fire Station in Wedron, again these books are free and do not need to be returned.

- 6. Last but not least, for any questions, please email Pdsmith@rwrlibrary.org and I will help in any way I can We really hope to re-open on April 8th but that still remains fluid.

Throughout the COVID-19 epidemic JLDH had been allowed to stay open per the guidelines of Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS). As the weeks progressed about half of our clients were staying home with a parent who was off work. This allowed us to keep the distance between the remaining attending children at greater distances. Staff took the time to explain to these children the need for "social distancing" but they were still, very much loved. They seemed to understand and gradually accepted "social distancing". They stayed their distance and still had happy smiles and learned to keep their hands to him/herself. The normal teachings of handwashing but doing it much

disintecting were ramped up reintorcing our usual teaching of handwashing but doing it much oftener. Children were taught how to keep themselves safe from viruses/germs. There were great educational learning sessions for the children regarding virus and germs.

BUT, on Friday, March 20th at 5:45 P.M., DCFS notified our director that day care centers have been ordered to close effective March 21. So now our doors will temporarily be closed until DCFS, our licensing agency, gives the permission to open again. We thank our dedicated staff for being present with the children teaching them and practicing "social distancing" and

other important health lessons.
