1 John 2:3-6 "And we can be sure that we know him if we obey his commandments If someone claims, "I know God," but doesn't obey God's commandments, that person is a liar and is not living in the truth. But those who obey God's word truly show how completely they love him. That is how we know we are living in him. Those who say they live in God should live their lives as Jesus did."

The 5 Subject Notebook Set Up

Section 1 – Review

List scriptures you want to go back and reread again, anything you have heard during a sermon, seminar, or Bible study class; any passage of Scripture or Bible story that you want to remember.

Section 2 – Memorizing and Meditating on Scripture

Practice memorizing and meditating on Scripture. A good time to memorize Scripture is during your study time. Other times are when you are meditating, exercising, walking or running.

Review the section on Memorizing scripture and Meditating on scripture to help you set up this section in your notebook. Write down a verse to memorize and meditate on for the week.
