# Breaking Brakes

Marc,

Here is a little personal experience note

### Beware of Wilwood brake kits.

I put one of these kits on my '65 Mustang late last year and have had problems with the metallurgy of the disk/hub assemble. This broke up into pieces in one case during an autocross run and was on its way out when caught on the other side. Seems the metal inside the hub where you seat your roller bearings comes off over time. These little shavings mix with the grease and get into the roller bearings seizing the rollers up in their races. Then you have the entire bearing trying to spin inside the hub. This then creates clearance so that the disks wobble. This can be noticed by the car starting to have worse handling and a soft initial brake feel. Stripped the whole thing down and installed new NAPA rotors and bearings after cleaning thoroughly. Problem has now gone away and the car performs as it used to prior to the Wilwood kit being installed. No warranty of course on the parts even though problem developed before a year was up (7 months). I have retained the Wilwood calipers for now.

Upon talking to several people in the SCCA who autocross and had added the Wilwood disk brake kit I also learned I have not been the only one bitten by this. Several others had experienced problems with their kits and one report was that the caliper body also would flex. Needless to say I have been very disappointed in this kit and just wanted to warn others in our club that may be thinking of buying one and those that already may have a kit on their car.


