53RD ANNUAL LIGHTNING CHAMPAGNE & CLASSIC BOAT REGATTA—WRAP-UP

Thanks to all the KYC members, Race Committee and club staff as well as the other sailing fleets for their support of our 53rd Annual Champagne regatta held this past weekend. There were 19 competitors racing in two fleets this year, classic and open. Once again we had the support of the ILCA Classic Lightning Group who held their annual get together at our Club.

The Open division was able to get in 6 races over 2 days. The Classic group sailed three races on Saturday, and one long distance race on Sunday consisting of a 3.5 mile upwind leg to the south beyond Gold Seal and a 3.5 mile downwind finish in 15 - 20 mph conditions. 13 boats traveled in to join the fun, one participant hauling his 1961 Lightning from Key West, Florida to attend (earning him the furthest traveled trophy). Other attendees came from Maryland and Vermont, as well as from Cazenovia Lake and various clubs on Lake Ontario.

Winds were brisk and the weather was spectacular, could not have asked for better conditions. Congratulations to John Newell, Jim Barnash, and Tom King for their success in the modern fleet. Bob Astrove edged out Craig Thayer in a tie breaker in the Classic fleet, with our own Roger and Andrew Slade taking 3rd (see full results on page 3). Roger handed off the tiller on Sunday to one of his crew, Sam Dutilis, a 19 year old from Chaumont Bay who is planning to skipper in the Junior North American championships coming up in early August at Pymatuning Yacht Club (PA). Roger and Andrew will also be crewing in that regatta for Bob Astrove in the Masters division.

It was exciting to see the many juniors participating in both fleets. Kevin Gahagan has given "Purple Haze" (Leon Fontier's old boat) a new life—with a good restoration able to handle the stiff breeze. Leah Bourne was the KYC top finisher in the modern fleet with a 4th with crew Pearson Deloe and Brent Penwarden IV.

Again, thanks to the volunteers and club members who make this regatta successful and a special shout out to Gage Slade who did so much of the legwork on this one. Once again I received many compliments from the attendees on the friendliness of our members, the organization of the event and what a beautiful sailing venue, location, and facility we are able to enjoy.

Looking forward to other fleet events in the coming year.
