THE FOUR C's OF THE SHEPHERD'S PSALM

In searching for something for my editorial I ran across this article in a little Devotional book of Sis. Lula Parham's that, among other books of hers, was left for the Apostolic Faith Movement to be kept with the Apostolic Faith Report. It is titled "God's Message" and was copywrited in 1931.

"The Lord is my shepherd . . . and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever." Psalm 23: 1-6

"This is the Psalm of the four "C's." "CONFI-DENCE" in the Lord. "CONTENTMENT" in the heart. "COURAGE" amidst dangers. "COMPLETENESS" here, and hereafter.

These are life's four greatest qualities. And they are for us; not for angels! But if we are to possess them we must take them in the Psalmist's order.

Confidence in God is first. Contentment can never sing in your heart without confidence. This is true in your home; and among friends. It is true also with God. Nor does courage long live when confidence and contentment are dead. And who could ever hope for completeness in this life, or in any other, without a foundation in God for it?

Let me commend to you the four "C's" of this Shepherd Psalm. Make them yours, and be unafraid. Jesus is the "Good Shepherd."

It is one of the first scriptures we learn to quote as children and it is our solace at the end of life's way. It is used at funerals as comfort to the bereaved family; and hundreds of times through our lives as we face difficult situations. As I sat by my mother's bed and watched her life ebb away by degrees, it was what I quoted over and over to her as her last words to me were, "Naomi, Pray". It comforted my heart and it brought a sweet smile to her face. I expect My Shepherd to be there when I cross over; COMPLETENESS will be mine then and until that time for whatever He sees fit to send my way I know that His CONFIDENCE, CONTENTMENT, and COUR-AGE will be mine for the asking. **n r b** The Lord is the source of my supply, I shall not want.

LESSONS IN CHRISTIAN LIVING By Mrs. Opal White Hertford, North Carolina

This classic melody, belonging to a child's world of Christian education, has sprung up from the Sunday school classroom to be heard in the adult field of Gospel music. Although the music ad sometimes the lyric has undergone radical change, the message is the same. Namely, that the Believer in Christ is to "Let his light so shine . . ."

This

Christ made this statement of truth to his followers after introducing Himself as "the Light of the world." He taught His disciples, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father, who is in heaven" (Matt. 5:14, 15).

It is evident that lights shine brightest in dark places. Such a light has been lit against the dark background of Watergate. The conversion of former White House aide Charles Colson and Senator Harold Hughes.

Colson and Hughes were interviewed by CBS Mike Wallace on ,'60 Minutes." Mr. Wallace commented that both have "recently renewed their faith in Christ." He said, "One senses that Hughes is the teacher, and Colson is the student."

At the close of the interview, Senator Hughes declared, "I know that Chuck Colson accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Saviour. I know by that very acceptance and surrender to Jesus Christ that the debts for all his sins were paid on that cross 2,000 years ago in the spiritual realm. That does not absolve man's physical needs in a material world for the justice of the courts. But it certainly cleanses his soul and his being for eternity. And he has salvation."

Syndicate columnist Nick Thimmesch who wrote the testimony of Senator Hughes (Saturday Evening Post, June/July) said, "Nothing quite like Hughe's decision has occurred in the history of the Senate." He continued, "In Washington, many were flabbergasted. Religion is no stranger here, but to actually give up earthly power to go with God is regarded as strange."

In the article Hughes "declared that he was renouncing politics for Jesus Christ when he declined to run for reelection next year."

Many have shed the false lights of Hollywood, Radio, Broadway, and TV to become 'lightbearers of the truth found only in Jesus Christ." Skitter Davis told the world on a recent TV interview, "I believe my absence from the world of country western music is my most effective witness to Jesus Christ as my personal Saviour."

Pat Boone and family now "Sing a new song," witnessing to their personal faith in Christ. Their "light" is shining brightly in concert across our trobuled country.

After a silent drop-out from TV's famous nationwide program 'He-Haw," Lulu Roman has made her comeback through the Person and power of Jesus Christ. She, too, is singing new songs and through the telling of her faith in Christ. On a nationwide TV program she declared, 'My whole hearts desire is to tell the whole world what Christ means to me."

We who live on the lower plane of everyday living may wonder if our "light" shines out bright enough to "light" the way to Christ so that others may come to Him. Someone said, "A pilot light may seem as insignificant part of a furnace. It is usually hidden from view and gives off so little heat or light that very few notice. Yet if the pilot light failed, the furnace would not function.

Inconsequential though the "little light" may seem, it is actually very important.

Remember the old song, "Let the lower lights be burning?" Though we may be one of those "lower lights," let's remember this, that the same Light that "lit up" those higher "lights," lit our candle, too! So, "Hide it under a bushel, No- I'm gonna le it shine . . ." Nor will we "let old Satan blow it out, No! I'm gonna let it shine . . ."

As Believers in the "Light of the world," we choose to affirm the positive and continue to sing along with multitudes: "Let it shine until Jesus comes, I'm gonna let is shine . . . Let it shine ,let it shine, let it shine."

Essential to a continual shining is to maintain a Spirit-filled lamp. "But ye shall receive power, after the Holy Ghost is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

It was the five wise virgins who had kept their lamps filled that went in with the Bridegroom to the marriage. The five foolish? While they hurried out to buy oil to fill their lamps, the five wise, along with the Bridegroom, went into the marriage "and the door was shut" (Matt. 25:1-13). Upon their return, they found the door to be indeed shut. To their plea for the door to be opened, Jesus the Bridegroom said, "Verily I say unto you, I know you not." The thirteenth verse sounds a stern and awesome warning: "Watch, therefore; for ye know not the day nor the hour in which the Son of man cometh." Only those who had filled lamps were ready. This truth should serve us in the Christian community to make "our calling and election sure" day by day. He could come today . . .

The First Sign: Israel to Become a Nation

This sign is the most important. If this sign were not present in the world today, nothing else would be relevant. Every generation has witnessed some of the signs of the return of the Messiah — so that it has always seemed that He might come in their time. But there never has been a time, before this generation, when this first sign has appeared. It is a warning of God's timepiece, Israel. Moses first predicted that because the people of Israel would not believe God and would turn away from Him, they would be scattered around the world. He said a great nation would come and take them captive and they would serve this nation while their own nation would be destroyed. This is the first part of a two-part prophecy regarding Israel's history.

Other prophets added details. The dispersion of the people occurred in 600 BC when the Babylonian Nebuchadnezzar swept in and took the Jewish people captive. Jerusalem, along with the temple was utterly destroyed. In Babylon the Jews were held against their will for exactly seventy years, just as Jeremiah the prophet had predicted.

Jeremiah 25:8-13

"Therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts; Because ye have not heard my words,

Behold, I will send and take all the families of the north, saith the Lord, and Nebuchadnezzar the kind of Babylon, my servant, and will bring them against this land, and against the inhabitants thereof, and against all these nations round about, and will utterly destroy the, and make them an astonishment, and an hissing, and perpetual desolations.

Moreover I will take from them the voice of mirth, and the voice of gladness, the voice of the bridegroom, and the voice of the bride, the sound of the millstones, and the light of the candle.

And this whole land shall be a desolation, and an astonishment; and these nations shall serve the king of Babylon seventy years.

And it shall came to pass, when seventy years are accomplished, that I will punish the king of Babylon, and that nation, saith the Lord, for their iniquity, and the land of the Chaldeans, and will make it perpetual desolations.

And I will bring upon that land all my words which I have pronounced against it, even all that is written in this book which Jeremiah hath prophesied against all the nations."

Just as Moses predicted, and Jesus added more detail, Titus and the Roman legion totally crushed the Jewish people in AD 70. The Romans destroyed Jerusalem and sold the survivors into slavery, dispersing them throughout the world and into exile that has lasted to this present generation.

In Ezekiel, the prophet predicts that just shortly before the Messiah will return and set up His Kingdom here on earth, these scattered Jewish people will return to become a nation again.

Ezekiel 36:8-12, 24-30, 34-36

"But ye, O mountains, of Israel, ye shall shoot forth your branches, and yield your fruit to my people of Israel; for they are at hand to come.

For, behold, I am for you, and I will turn unto you, and ye shall be tilled and sown: .

And I will multiply men upon you, all the house of Israel, even all of it: and the cities shall be inhabited, and the wastes shall be builded:

And I will multiply upon you man and beast; and they shall increase and bring fruit: and I will settle you after your old estates, and will do better unto you than at your beginnings: and ye shall know that I am the Lord.

Yea, I will cause men to walk upon you, even my people Israel; and they shall possess thee, and thou shalt be their inheritance, and thou shalt no more henceforth bereave them of men.

For I will take you from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land.

Then will I sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols, will I cleanse you.

A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh.

And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.

And ye shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; and ye shall be my people, and I will be your God.

I will also save you from all your uncleannesses: and I will call for the corn, and will increase it, and lay no famine upon you.

And I will multiply the fruit of the tree, and the increase of the field, that ye shall receive no more reproach of famine among the heathen.

And the desolate land shall be tilled, whereas it lay desolate in the sight of all that passed by.

And they shall say, This land that was desolate is become like the garden of Elen; and the waste and desolate and ruined cities are become fenced, and are inhabited.

Then the heathen that are left round about you shall know that I the Lord build the ruined places, and plant that that was desolate: I the Lord have spoken it, and I will do it."

Jesus, the Messiah (before He was taken to be crucified), in speaking of the events that would immediately precede His return, told of the return of the Jews to the land of Palestine. As a nation, He said, they would be in possession of Old Jerusalem. Now remember that! He also said that this generation which saw the Jews back to their land and in possession of Old Jerusalem would see His return!

Luke 21:25-36

"And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring;

Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken.

And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh.

And he spake to them a parable; Behold the fig tree, and all the trees;

When they now shoot forth, ye see and know of your own selves that summer is now nigh at hand.

So likewise ye, when ye see these things come to pass, know ye that the kingdom of God is nigh at hand.

Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass away, till all be fulfilled.

Heaven and earth shall pass away: but my words shall not pass away.

And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares.

For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth.

Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man."

That is what Ezekiel was predicting 2600 years ago.

On November 29th, 1947 the United Nations voted to partition Palestine into Jewish and Arab States. Jews approved plans but it was rejected by the Arabs. But May 14, 1948 British ended the Palestinian mandate. The state of Israel was proclaimed. The Flag of David is now flying over Israel for the first time in many hundred years.

When the Jews became a nation again in 1948, that was the most important sign any generation could see.

Jesus warned that we who watched the rebuilding of the Israeli nation are a destined generation. We should know, as positively as spring buds announce the summer, that the season has come: The end He spoke of is

near! Luke 21:28 — What are these "things taking place" which we should anticipate? They are new and unprecedented events which are intertwined with the ancient promise of God to Abraham, father of the Jewish nation. Genesis 12:1-, 2

"Now the Lord had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing."

This promise has not been broken although the ravages of time, persecutions, and wars have almost succeeded in pushing Abraham's people into oblivion. What has this to do with the end of time? Simply this: The ancient prophets linked the rebuiling of Israel to the last days of history and the Second Coming of Christ. The Jewish people, after a long period of exile would return. Israel would be rebuilt against overwhelming odds right in the face of her enemies. Read Ezek. 38 and 39.

Ezekiel the prophet saw that the reborn nation's enemies would be supported by Moscow, the powers from the North. Research of old historical records will show that Ezekiel's terms Meshach, Gog, and Tubal are ancestoral Russian names. The people of Meshech became subjects of Gog, the ancient prince Rosh. Later these tribesmen were called Muski. Herodotus, the historian, referred to these people as Moschoi. From these names Moscow, Russia is derived Ezekiel's term Tubal is synonymous with Tobal, a river in Russia. Tubolski, a city on that river, has the same name origin. Ezekiel prophesied the Moscorietes' hatred of Israel centuries ago.

Christ, speaking of the period of Israel's rebirth, described it as: Luke 21:25-36. A time when man's attention would be turned toward the moon and space. A perplexing and greatly distressing period of the nations of the earth. An age of the uprising and rebelliousness of the mass wanes of Humanity. "The roaring of the tossing sea."

Jude later refers to those rebellious masses as "carousing together — openly — without scruple — They are clouds without water, swept along by the winds, wild waves of the sea, flinging up the foam of their own shame.

According to Luke, Jesus says it will be an age of heart failure, anxiety, and fear. An age of breakdown which would even see the shaking apart of the powers and laws of the universes, the laws of time, distance, gravity, and the breaking down of matter.

This is a generation which would see the emerging of nations. More nations have been formed and have come to play a part in world politics in this century than all of the last 2000 years together. From 1950 to 1966 51 new nations were born, and from 1966 to 1970 41 new nations came into existance. Luke 21:29-30 And He told them a parable: Look at the fig tree. (The fig tree is symbolic of Israel: it appears on the national seal) and all trees; When they put forth their buds. These are the new nations.

This is a time when people will be caught up in a life of trivia, silliness, entertainment, and indulging; also an age of mental depression. We are warned to be on guard lest our hearts be depressed, weighed down with the giddiness and nausea of self-indulgence, drunkenness, and worldly worries and cares." This is also a time when even serious minded people would be so wrapped up in the business of the day that they would be unaware of the coming events.

Jesus Christ will Return! Many people will not be ready, yet it is true — Christ wants us all to be ready.

The Second Sign: Jews Return to Old Jerusalem

The second sign is this: before the Messiah can return the Jews must possess Old Jerusalem. Much of the warfare in the last war of the world will be over the city of Jerusalem.

Zechariah writes about the battle of Jerusalem, one of the campaigns of Armageddon, The War of Wars! He tells us in Zechariah 12:2-4, 9 that the last war of the world is triggered over a dispute about who owns Jerusalem. Now this was a writing 500 years before Jesus was born.

"Behold, I will make Jerusalem a cup of trembling unto all the people round about, when they shall be in the siege both against Judah and against Jerusalem.

And in that day will I make Jerusalem a burdensome stone for all people: all that burden themselves with it shall be cut in pieces, though all the people of the earth be gathered together against it.

In that day, saith the Lord, I will smite every horse with astonishment, and his rider with madness: and I will open mine eyes upon the house of Judah, and will smite every horse of the people with blindness.

And it shall come to pass in that day, that I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem."

The whole purpose of the Six Day War in June of 1967 was to get Old Jerusalem back again. Do you realize that for the first time in 2500 years the Jews have total possession and sovereign control of Old Jerusalem? They have never totally controlled it since they were taken to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar and yet they have it now.

Since these two signs have set the stage for the coming of Jesus the Messiah again, every other sign we see today has great significance. If the first two signs were not true, the other signs would have no more significance than they had in 1940 or any other time. There has never been a time before when the Jews were returned from a world wide dispersion and in total possession of Old Jerusalem.

The Third Sign: Rebuilding of the Temple

The third sign has not been revealed, but it will soon. The Jew is to rebuild the temple again in Old Jerusalem. Documents discovered last year show us that all the stones and all other materials are now ready for rebuilding the temple. This could be accomplished in just a short time.

The Fourth Sign: A Russian attack on Israel

The fourth sign could only happen after the Jews were a nation again in their ancient homeland. Ezekiel (chapter 38) predicts the restoring of the people as a nation. He said that after the Jews are returned from this dispersion, there is going to arise a fantastic power from

their uttermost North. This Northern Nation would become their arch-enemy and this nation would actually be involved in a direct attack upon Israel, triggering the last war of the world. Men who have studied this passage have identified this power by ethnic background. Meshech, Magog, and Tubal are tribal names as old as history itself. These tribes are descendants of Japeth, the son of Noah, and are named in Genesis 10. Experts on ancient Hebrew declare, "This is referring to the tribes that now form the Russian people." Read Gen. 10.

Russia is the only nation to the uttemost north of Israel. If you take a globe and go directly north, you will arrive in the midst of Russia. If you want to read the future of Russia, read Ezekiel 38-39. All of Russia and its Communist confederacies are mentioned, including the Arabs.

The Fifth Sign: A Final Arabic-Israeli War

At the same time this northern power will arise, there will develop a confederacy of Arabs who will unite in common hatred of the nations. Finally, they will actually launch an all out attack against the nation of Israel, bringing about the last war of the world.

October 6, 1973 — the Israel-Arab threat is one of the key situations of all prophecy. We call the Near East boiling pot the "Bear Trap", because the Bible says that just such a situation will trigger the last great battle, ARMAGEDDON. Again the stage is set. The armies of the Arab world, backed by Moscow and all the Red Communist World are set against Israel and her allies. Will this be another feint, another bluff, or is this the real thing that will plunge the world into World War III and the great day of God's vengeance against the powers of evil? Time will tell.

The time of the end is defined for us in Daniel. It is the time when Christ comes back. The king of the South is also identified for us in this chapter. He is Egypt in league with the Arab nations and Egypt will be the leader. The king of the North (Russia) will stretch out his hands against the countries, and the land of Egypt will not escape. Russia is going to double-cross the Egyptians. Russia will become ruler of the wealth-filled treasuries of Egypt. The Libyans and the Ethiopians will also be captured. The words in the Hebrew translated as "Libyan" and "Ethiopian" do not mean what we think of today as the countries of Libya and Ethiopia. These words refer to a whole race of people. The word translated as "Libyan" means the African Arabs, all of them. The word in the Hebrew translated as "Ethiopian", is the word Cush" which means "black man," and is talking about the Black Africans.

Russia, with its confederates, is going to make a lightning-like thrust through the Middle East and conquer the whole African continent. Daniel said, "But while Russia is doing all of this conquest of the African continnent reports from the East and from the North shall alarm him so he (the Russian) shall withdraw in great fury to destroy and annihilate many." While the Russian army is down in Egypt and Africa, news from the North and East will trouble it. If you look to the North of Africa, what do you see? Europe. And as you look to the East, you see Asia.

The Sixth Sign: China Will Enter the Mid-East War

While all of this is going on, there will be a great confederacy of Asians formed. They are going to come into this battle once the Arabs and Russians begin. Rev. 16: 12-14, 16 tells us about their entrance on the scene. The kings of the East will come and stage their armies on the banks of the Euphrates River.

Revelation 16: 12-14, 16

"And the sixth angel poured out his vial upon the great river Euphrates; and the water thereof was dried up, that the way of the kings of the East might be prepared.

And I saw three unclean spirits like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon, and out of the mouth of the beast, and out of the mouth of the false prophet.

For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty.

And he gathered them together into a place called in the Hebrew tongue Armageddon."

This is the news which comes from the East to trouble the Russians. Revelation 9 tells us in symbolic language that a vast army will come from the Euphrates River. This Eastern power will build an army of two hundred million soldiers. China, right now, boasts a militia of over 200 million soldiers. India is taking Pakistan to the U.N. General Assembly because Pakistan was cooperating with the Red Chinese to build a road over the mountains which separate them, a road connecting the Red Chinese with the subcontinent — a straight shot to the Euphrates River.

The Rebirth of the State of Israel

November 29, 1947 the United Nations voted to partition Palestine into Jewish and Arab states. May 14, 1948, the State of Israel proclaimed, and is by far the greatest Biblical event that has taken place during the twentieth century. The Bible calls this land, "the land of Israel". God promised thousands of years ago that His people would possess it. The call of Abraham was to this land. When God brought Israel out of Egypt with a mighty band, it was to bring them into this land. In our time, no other spot on earth is capturing so much attention, for the Bible teaches that the final drama of human history as we know it will be enacted in Israel - His Land! Hope rises in the hearts of millions as this genera. tion witnesses the returning of the Jewish peoples from the world over to their homeland. This great move brings to pass the Bible's declaration of centuries' standing, "My people shall come home."

When the Bible deals with things which are coming on the earth, it calls itself "a more sure word." It likens itself to "a light that shineth in a dark place." Before Jesus went back to Heaven, He told us that He would send us the Spirit of Truth, Who would show us things to come.

HIS LAND

Let us look at Israel, and more so around Jerusalem. People have died just to live in the Holy Land. Others have lived just to die in the Holy Land. Why? Why Israel, in the Heart of the Holy Land? Why in such a little place?

You can drive over it in a day or fly over it in an hour. In it are seas where nothing swims, and a desert where nothing grows. As real estate, it is nothing much. Here is a country so tiny it is inconspicuous on a map of the world.

No other part of the world, square foot for square foot, has played such a historic role in man's life; YET, there in that little place every ethic of Western Man was born. The Bible, or much of it, was written, and every man has a root deep in the stubborn soil.

As you study about Jerusalem, Bethlehem, or Galilee, you will be following the course of a man that changed the course of billions of lives. Yet! If Israel is only a dot on the map of the world, Jerusalem is only a dot on the map of Israel. Study any part of it or all of it, every inch is History. The Bible is the best guide book of the Holy Land. In a land of miracles; miracles are to be expected. You will see the harvesting of chemicals from the Dead Sea where nothing swims, and oranges from the dessert where nothing grows.

A variety of terrain makes up this area — desserts, mountains, forests, grassland and seashores. The Holy Land also provides habitats for an exceptionally wide range of plant life, about 22,500 species of trees, shrubs, and plants.

The climate of the small country ranges from Arctic at the summit of 9,400 foot Mount Herman to tropical along the shores of the Dead Sea which is 1292 feet below the level of the Mediterranean Sea.

Because it lies "at the crossroads of three continents", the Holy Land has a tremendous variety of wildlife. Almost every kind of bird that inhabits Northern Africa, Southern Europe and Western Asia has been seen in the Bible Land.

The Regathering

Micah 5:2 The one who is to rule in Israel.

"But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler of Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." Ezekiel 34: 11-13

"For thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I, even I, will both search my sheep, and seek them out.

As a shepherd seeketh out his flock in the day that he is among his sheep that are scattered; so will I seek out my sheep, and will deliver them out of all places where they have been scattered in the cloudy and dark day.

And I will bring them out from the people, and gather them from the countries, and will bring them to their own land, and feed them upon the mountains of Israel by the rivers, and in all the inhabited places of the country."

Jeremiah 16: 15

But, The Lord liveth, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the North, and from all the lands whither he had driven them: and I will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.

Isaiah 43: 5-6

Fear not: for I am with thee: I will bring thy seed from the East, and gather thee from the West;

I will say to the North, Give up; and to the South, Keep not back; bring my sons from far, and my daughters from the ends of the earth;

Isaiah 43: 19-20

Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.

The beast of the field shall honour me, the dragons and the owls: because I give waters in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert, to give drink to my people, my chosen.

Isaiah 52: 9-10

Break forth into joy, sing together, ye waste places of Jerusalem: for the Lord hath comforted his people, he hath redeemed Jerusalem.

The Lord hath made bare his holy arm in the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Ezekiel 36: 24, 28

For I will take you from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land,

And ye shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; and ye shall be my people, and I will be your God.

The previous passages, with many others, describe the great regathering of Israel to the Holy Lands which is to take place in the very last days. Throughout these verses the direct working of God and spiritual blessings to Israel are made prominent. Throughout the proprecies many additional details are given concerning this wonderful time. None of these prophecies were fulfilled in the return of Israel from Babylon after the seventy years of bondage. This return is a second regathering, as prophesied in Isaiah 11: 11-12.

And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall set his hand again the second time to recover the remnant of his people, which shall be left, and Assyria, and from Egypt, and from Pathros, and from Cush, and from Elam, and from Shinar, and from Hamath, and from the islands of the sea.

And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth.

Jeremiah 31: 35-27 tells us that following this regathering, Israel shall never cease from being a nation. Amos 9: 15

And I will plant them upon their land, and they shall no more be pulled up out of their land which I have given them, saith the Lord thy God.

Already we see the fulfillment of God's Holy Word. What about these prophets, Ezekiel, Daniel, Isaiah, Jeremiah, and others? Did they write their books after the occurrence of the events which they describe? If so, they must have written during the twentieth century! NO! They wrote of these things some two thousand five hundred years before our day.

II Peter 1: 21

For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

The renewal of national life in the Jewish homeland has been accompanied by some remarkable changes in Jerusalem. In the case of that city which God has chosen out of all the Earth, "to set His Name there."

With this we are living in one of the greatest times in History.
