



Feast of the Transfiguration Year A Matthew 17:1-9



“Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, “Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.” While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.” When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, “Rise, and do not be afraid.” And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, “Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.”

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of the Transfiguration Year A

Matthew 17:1-9

Happy Transfiguration Feast! The last time we heard this gospel about Jesus' Transfiguration was back in March when we were in the liturgical desert of Lent (2nd Sunday of Lent). This time around we may feel more at home in the desert, with our near-100 degree temperatures outside. Yet, we may also feel disoriented by the seemingly mirage of time's quick passing. It feels like only yesterday that it was March. Yet, what a transformation from then until now! Just a glimpse of how things can change (from Lent to Easter and Winter to Summer!) But, that is precisely the lesson of the Transfiguration of Jesus: that Jesus brings conversion of life and transformative change to us.

Jesus' transfiguration accomplishes three things. It 1) Identifies Jesus as God Incarnate, it 2) Identifies Peter, James & John as Jesus' pick for leadership positions & it 3) Empowers Peter, James & John and all of us as disciples to rise above our own small lives so as to let Christ shine through us.

First, by identifying Jesus as God himself, this transfiguration scene mirrors other great revelatory theophanies in scripture (God-Appearances similar to what Moses, Elijah & Israelites received). This magnificent manifestation of God induces wonder and awe in whoever witnesses it. Jesus emanates radiant white light as bright as the sun! "His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light" (Matthew 17:2) This is similar to the divine appearances to Moses in the burning bush, "*LORD appeared to him as fire flaming out of a bush. When he looked, although the bush was on fire, it was not being consumed*" (Exodus 3:2) Also, Elijah receives such a theophany when God came to him as "*a fiery chariot and fiery horses came between the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind*" (2Kings 2:11) The Israelites too, received such a divine visitations, as when "*the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the blast of the shofar and the mountain smoking, they became afraid and trembled*" (Exodus 20:18).

Secondly, Jesus' transfiguration singles out Peter James and John as marked for unique leadership to join the company of the great Moses & Elijah. But we might ask why there is not a third OT figure with Moses & Elijah (like David or Joshua) to make a complementary parallel for the three of Peter, James and John. Well, Jesus is the third Himself, and this lineup proves that He perfectly embodies the best of Moses and Elijah and completes/fulfills the Law of Prophets of the Old Testament. There is no comparison among New Testament leaders & Old Testament leaders. This asymmetry (two OT figures and three NT figures) is Jesus' way of preventing the apostles from arrogantly abusing their leadership. Jesus is telling them, that He is the One. They will lead, but He will be leading in them. They will be serving in His Name. He is to work within them. Of course, that requires Peter James and John to grow beyond themselves, to transcend their little selves, and be raised up to Jesus' own witness in them.

Which, thirdly, bring us to the third accomplishment of the Transfiguration. We are called to transcend ourselves and be changed into the image of Christ by our sacrifices of love and service in His Name, too. Baptism initiates this Christ-life in us. As St Paul says in Galatians 2:20 "yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me". Encountering Christ, accepting Him and letting Him live through us, means that we must rise to the mind and life of Christ, being transfigured ourselves, or reoriented to that 'greater than ourselves' that is life beyond us (other-centered). Philippians 2:5 tells us to "Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus" and Romans 12:2 says that we are "not to conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God." Accepting and living for Christ means that we let His light work in us. We are changed by it. Christ transfigures us and asks us to see beyond ourselves. In Matthew 5:16, Jesus says, "let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." Jesus calls us to be re-newed in Him, to be Christ-like to others. As Colossians 3:9-10 says, "since you have taken off the old self with its practices, put on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator." Then in Christ's light, we too are transfigured-transformed. The more light, the more like Christ. And it only gets better and brighter with Him. 1 John 3:2 states that "while what we shall be has not yet been revealed fully. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is...."
