

KNOW YOUR FAITH

Fr., why do I have to attend a Catholic church on Sunday vs. a protestant church? As long as I attend any church, I keep my Sabbath, right?



My dear fellow Catholic, I will attempt to answer your question by first clarifying the second part of the question that keeping the Sabbath is not only about attendance at a church, Catholic or protestant. It is about taking a break from your regular busyness of the week and spending time with the Lord of our life.

Spending time with the Lord is like a coin with two sides; it is like a whole with two dependent parts. One part cannot be said to be complete without the other. It is like the body and soul that makes a human. On one hand, spending time with the Lord is building with him the kingdom of God here on earth, a kingdom of right relationship with our neighbor, a kingdom of love, justice and peace. Such kingdom requires us to be attentive to the needs of our neighbors. Attending to those who are sick, who are hungry, thirsty, naked, homeless, in jail, dying, or dead. Doing any of these could excuse us, on particular occasions, from attending a Sunday Mass.

On the other hand spending time with the Lord is giving him honor, praise, thanksgiving, and worship, especially on the Lord's Day. According to the precept and law of the Church, these are appropriately done by our active participation at the Holy Mass. The Holy Mass, according to the Church's teaching is the highest form of worship or sacrifice of thanksgiving and praise anyone can give to God. It is more than just congregating in order to sing and share the Word of God from the scriptures. It is a sacrifice of Christ Himself wherein Christ is the victim of sacrifice, the altar of sacrifice and the priest offering the sacrifice. "In the Mass it is Christ Himself who worships the Father, joining our worship to His. In no other way is it possible to adequately give thanks (eucharistia) to God for the blessings of creation, redemption and our sanctification than by uniting our offerings to that of Jesus Christ Himself" (Colin B. Donovan, "Sunday Mass and Holy Day Obligation").
