#### **FIRST READING**

From the Prophecy of Zephaniah

(3:14-18)

14 Shout for joy, O daughter of Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be gad and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! 15 The Lord has removed the judgment against you; he has turned away your enemies; the King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst, vou have no further misfortune to fear. <sup>16</sup> On that day, it shall be said to Jerusalem: Fear not, O Zion, be not discouraged! <sup>17</sup> The Lord, your God is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, 18 as one sings at festivals.

#### **GOSPEL**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (1:39-56)

R/. Glory to you, o Lord.

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, <sup>40</sup> where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. <sup>41</sup> When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, <sup>42</sup> cried out in a loud voice and said: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. <sup>43</sup> And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? <sup>44</sup> For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. <sup>45</sup> Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled.

<sup>46</sup> And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; <sup>47</sup> my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. <sup>48</sup> For he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call

me blessed: <sup>49</sup> the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name. <sup>50</sup> He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. <sup>51</sup> He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. <sup>52</sup> He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. <sup>53</sup> He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. <sup>54</sup> He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, <sup>55</sup> the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever."

- That our local community, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Jesus and our mother, may be open to welcome all whom we encounter in our daily living. Let us pray to the Lord: R/.

Father most Holy, you will that all men come to know your Son Jesus Christ. Accept our petitions and, in your infinite mercy, grant us our requests. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
