

doodle in ways that help you remember the importance of your learning. As you ponder through the season of Lent, take time for yourself so you can look at your own life and your relationship with God.

It has been over a month since we have come back into the sanctuary for worship along with offering the online services. Sunday School started up a week later than the sanctuary worship. It is good to have people, adults and children, back in the church on Sunday mornings. We are still watching the numbers, praying that there continues to be a reduction in people who have Covid-19, that the new strands are limited, and that we have an increase for those who complete their vaccinations. The "word" is we will need to continue wearing our masks and continue to be cautious as we 're-enter' our world. The

pandemic has not gone away, but it does feel like there is hope on the horizon.

In 2020, we began working with the Matthew 25 program. It seems to have been overshadowed by the pandemic. As we begin to reconnect with our community, we will be able to return to thinking about what it means to be a congregation with Vitality. Use some of this time to think about what the future of Community Presbyterian Church will look like. It is likely that it will not be exactly like it was prior to the pandemic.

#### HELP!


Community Presbyterian Church needs your help. Each Sunday we need a liturgist. Liturgists add a second voice to leading worship.



The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

The Mission Committee's goal this year is to raise \$1,300 for a family farm bundle. The project gives the livestock, tools, and training that a family might need to start their own farm for a reliable source of nourishment and income.
