

Friends -

Many changes are afoot in the United Methodist Church. Besides the change in leadership here at Richmond, the district that the congregation belongs to will be changing on July 1. We will go from being in the Blue Water District which encompassed the thumb south to Mt. Clemens, to being at the southern tip of the East Winds District which includes the eastern half of the thumb, and extends west past Flint. This will offer us opportunities to engage with rural, urban and suburban churches in powerful ministry.

May 30th is the beginning of the Michigan Area Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. Laura Pobanz and I will be representing Richmond First UMC at the conference in Traverse City. This will be the final year that Michigan is divided between the Detroit Conference and the West Michigan Conference. But, both conferences will gather together in a unified mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, across the state of Michigan. We will have the opportunity to network with churches and ministries around the state. We will vote on church policy. And we will be inspired by worship and speakers and trainings. Lastly, there is possible change coming in the denomination. In February there will be a special general conference (the worldwide church gathers) that will specifically address the way the church treats people who are gay and lesbian. Since January of 2017, the Commission on a Way Forward has met faithfully to draft a report that will assist the bishops of the United Methodist Church in making a good decision. The presentation of their report will take place at a Bishop's gathering April 29 - May 4.

The church is and has always been a dynamic living organism. Change is a sure sign of life! It is never easy, but as long as it is life-giving, it is worth it. Please be in prayer for all who are impacted by these changes. Pray for Pastor Tom and Family. Pray for the Commission on a Way Forward. Pray for the Council of Bishops. Pray for the United Methodist Churches in Michigan. Pray for all the people we want to serve.
