


INTRODUCTION: 2 Corinthians 1:3-4

Kristian Vester Frosig

Born to Emma and Mathias Frosig on December 20, 1927, in Vejrup, Denmark, Kristian Vester Frosig began his life in a bakery. Mathias would do the baking in the basement during the night, and Emma would tend to the bakery during the day while Mathias slept. Swaddling Kristian in blankets, Emma would put him in a basket, then put the basket in the snowbank outside the kitchen door for his afternoon naps. He claims he got a good healthy immune system from sleeping in the snowbank.

In May of 1929, the Frosig family made their way from Vejrup, Denmark to Minneapolis Minnesota. Life in a Danish bakery continued for Mathias. Emma gave birth to Doris, then Gilbert, Paul, and David. Kris said he cried on his first day of school because the kids made fun of the way he talked, half Dane half English. Emma said no more Danish, and she learned English right along with her children.

Kris and a couple of his friends left school at age 17 to join the Navy. His father took him to the train station one day early in January of 1946. In their good-bye, his dad took him by the hand and said, "Remember, you are a Frosig". That little saying is now passed from one generation to the next.

Kris flew patrol over what is now Alaska. Discharged honorably in November of 1947, he returned to Minneapolis. Continuing his education at Augsburg College on the GI bill, he had many many stories to tell of those college days. He cooked on a fishing boat in the Alaskan waters during the summers of his college years. Kris found out quickly that the Norwegian fisherman wanted the parts of the fish he threw overboard while making fish soup.

With a master's degree in Biology, he taught at Shoreline High School in Seattle for eight years. Then getting the call to go into the ministry, he returned to Minneapolis with his family to Augsburg Seminary, which became Luther Seminary during his time there. While in seminary, he also taught Bacteriology to the student nurses. "Someone had to do it" he would say.

Ordained in 1964, his first call was to Zion Lutheran Church in Kent WA. He was already hiking with daughters Kathy and Laurel, so he started hiking adventures with the youth group. 50 years later those kids have come back to him to say they never quit hiking and now their children are hikers, too. Kris' second call was to Central Lutheran Church Anchorage Alaska. He loved the outdoors, especially trips with son Christopher. They were part of a group of fathers and sons who hiked, canoed, and camped together. Also in Alaska, Kris and Pastor John Ericksen would travel out to the coastal villages; Kris, with his mandolin and John, with his guitar. Country Gospel was the order of worship. The music went on way into the early morning.

At First Lutheran in Bothell there are so many stories. He loved his time there, and his church family. Thanksgiving 1988, he cooked a beautiful dinner. Then he put a ring wrapped in cellophane between the pumpkin pie and the whipped cream, and handed it to Marilyn. Oh my goodness. Marilyn

adored him, but had no idea this was about to happen. Through screaming and tears she said 'yes'. Just in time, too, because his children were waiting by their phones to find out what she said.

Marilyn became a Frosig on April 8, 1989, and this love story began. Daughter, Kathy and her husband David had three little girls - Nikki, Allison, and Danielle. Daughter, Laurel and her husband David had three little girls - Hillary, Jenny, and Hailey. Son Christopher was in the Marines.

In 1993, when Kris and Marilyn decided to go to Denmark to find his family roots, Kris had to get a passport. His father naturalized in 1942, and his mother in 1943. No one naturalized Kris, so when we he tried to get his passport he did not have the proper document to get one. "Oh no, all this time I have been an illegal immigrant" he said. We had to get documents from the cathedral in Ribe, Denmark; no email then. Passport came three days before our trip. He too found out it's quite incredible to walk in the footprints of all those that had come before him.

By retirement from the ministry in 1994, Christopher married Chantelle, and in time there were two grandsons - Kristian and Ben. The grandkids called our place Camp Frosig. Come for a visit, have a science lesson, work on a craft, eat outside, spin and twirl and sing and hug. It has always been a happy place, and fun to share with others.

Kris loved his family beyond all measure; so proud to tell stories about them. Now Allison and Sam have Noelle and Caleb, Hillary and Justin have Addie and Lydia, and Danielle and Grant have Audrey. Kris' heart extended out, even to others he might meet only once. His little handmade crosses called Kris Crosses are everywhere. "Put it in your pocket" he would say, "You will never be alone". He also had a Wednesday afternoon ministry at the Manor Care convalescent center in Lynnwood.

Always with a smile, and sometimes with a twinkle in his eye, he had time for all those he met. He would remind anyone who said, "Have a nice day" to "Make it a great day; your choice". When you think of him with that joy he spread, hear his voice say, "Stand up, don't be afraid, go now and do some good".

Kristian Vester Frosig left to go see his Lord on Monday, January 16, 2017. A son, a brother, a cousin and uncle, Papa, father, grandfather, and great-great grandfather, too. A teacher, pastor, Danish immigrant, veteran, and friend. Gardener, cook, domestic, and a great sawdust maker (woodworker). A life well lived in service to others, and in service to his Lord.



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
