



Baptism and, gathering around our youth as they celebrate the faith given them, we affirm with them our faith and the power of the Holy Spirit within our lives and together within the church. In this moment of celebration we affirm that this faith and Spirit, this new life in Jesus Christ, come to us daily in all the seasons of our life together.

Resurrection, Pentecost, Confirmation are celebrations not of endings but of beginnings. We will gather on Sunday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, to celebrate the Day of Pentecost and Confirmation ... and, as we do on all Sundays, to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord. Come together, let the Spirit gather us around Word and Sacrament with our youth and with each other as we live each new day in the light of Jesus Christ!

Luther asks the meaning of the third article of the Apostle's Creed (about the Holy Spirit) and answers:

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy, and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins – mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.





The Upstate New York Synod Assembly will be held June 5-7 In Rochester. The theme this year is Racial Justice. The speakers, workshops, and mission expo will all reflect that theme. Attend any of the 15 workshops and hear about racial justice from various perspectives. Lastly, everyone can practice racial justice in their everyday lives: have conversations with your office or school companions, point out how the joke someone is telling is actually hurtful, pursue equality for all God's children. Inaction and silence are no longer options.

## Easter message



Easter is early this year, and in many places across this church trees will still be bare and fields barren. It might even snow. But on Easter morning we will gather to greet the risen Son and give thanks to God for the new life we have in Jesus Christ.

Two things come to mind this Easter when there is still only the hint of spring: Jesus' words to his disciples just before his crucifixion and a hymn.

Jesus said, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." Jesus was talking about his death, but he was also assuring his disciples and us that death is not the end, that, though it might seem impossible and even terrifying to step into the void, God brings life out of death.

The hymn is ELW 379.

Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, wheat that in dark earth many days has lain; love lives again, that with the dead has been; love is come again like wheat arising green.

The tune is actually a French Christmas carol. How perfect that, in the bleak midwinter, the promise of spring was planted.

St. Paul wrote, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" We have already fallen into the earth and died. "For

#### **Ruth** — a **Pentecost story?**

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost, originally a Jewish festival, when the Holy Spirit descended on them and birthed the church. Pentecost, which began as a harvest festival, had come to commemorate the giving of the law. The book of Ruth became integral to festival worship.

Why Ruth? This short story doesn't mention the law, let alone God giving it to Moses. Yet in Ruth's devotion to her mother-in-law ("Where you go I will go .... Your people will be my people ..." [Ruth 1:16, NIV]), she fulfills not just the letter but the spirit of the law: loving kindness — all the more remarkable because she's a foreigner. Boaz, too, demonstrates exorbitant kindness to Ruth.

As Christians celebrate the Spirit bridging differences in Jerusalem, uniting all nationalities by making the gospel message intelligible to all people, we too can remember Ruth's story. For in it, God unites two enemy peoples for his grand purpose: Boaz and Ruth's marriage leads to King David and, ultimately, to King Jesus. Today, the Holy Spirit continues to unite all categories of people under Christ's reign for the good of the world.
