
As a very young boy growing up, Dave was always fascinated with cows. Going to the neighbors when he heard the milking machine starting up, he was always right on the owner's hip taking in all the information he could. Growing up going through high school, he worked on a few different dairy farms. Little did he know at the time, was that knowledge he was taking in would serve him well in the future. After high school he decided he was going to take a trip to California, much to the dismay of his father. During that 6 month time he said with a grin, "I went to work at a Mercedes dealership. Who gets to put that on their resumé?" Returning to Michigan, Dave decided it was time to go to college for electronics. "I found out quickly that college was not for me." With that, he began a 15 year stint working at Care Free Windows in Charlotte, Michigan. "It was simply for stability." 


