

Back for the second time on February 11th, students from the Traditional Music Program at MoreHead State University graced the stage at Willis Music's WoodSongs Coffee House. This is an internationally acclaimed program providing the world with a taste of traditional mountain music forms and culture from an historical and contemporary perspective. The Group performed traditional music they have taken to multiple countries around the globe educating audiences in this All-American form of music.

Gene Thompson interviewed the program Directors providing insight into the workings of the program. It is always a joy to see the young students studying this form of music and learning about performing it. Hopefully they will return again next year. Door donations were given to the students for their efforts.





The Blue Eagle Band

The audience was delighted on March 11th as the Blue Eagle Band took the stage at Willis Music providing a lively mix of acoustic music, stories, jokes, and all round fun. Their style is best described as bluegrass and more...4 spirited musicians sang and performed covers of well known traditional Monroe and Stanley Bros. Music along with progressive bluegrass, 'newgrass' including favorites from Paul Simon, Crystal Gayle, and Credence Clearwater Revival, and some original material including solo, duet and trio vocals with a mix of instrumentals.

The band included Tom Adler on banjo, Jesse Pena on guitar, Noah Adler on mandolin, and Terri Powell on upright bass. Terri is one of the more active bass players to hit the stage moving with the beat, moving out front often to add harmony and lead vocals including an excellent job of interpreting the blues. So active that she joked her activities were giving the FitBit on her wrist a 'fit'.

This was truly an evening of music and fun.

When doing what has made other musicians famous as a band, you have two choices. One way is to do it exactly like the original musicians did it and be a nostalgia trip for the audience. A reminder, if you will, of what they liked about the original band. The other way is to do it in a similar fashion but with enough of your own talent and pizzazz to cover the first way and still make it your own unique sound.

Rick and Curney do the "Mountain Style" Bluegrass that made Ralph and Carter Stanley famous but sound like themselves which is a really good thing. These men are talented on there own with Rick hitting the right notes as did Ralph and Curney complementing the familiar vocal style. But they have also recruited some of Ralph's own band members, namely Sparkman and Rigsby, which is like pulling the future right out of the past.

Gene Thompson manages the Willis Woodsongs event schedule. He really likes the Stanley style of our Bluegrass Heritage Music. The great thing about this is it becomes really apparent when he brings in a band that can reproduce that style and Rick and Curney sure got it right! If you missed it....YOU REALLY MISSED IT!



The efforts of volunteers, the use of old woods donated from old buildings and adhering to the original design has allowed the General Store to keep it's historic landmark designation.
