FROM THE DESK OF FATHER PETER ADOKO-ENCHILL...

"Names"

Names and the naming ceremony are very important in my tribe and most

tribes in Ghana. Normally, one is given a name eight days after birth just like the Jews who had to present their firstborn son into the temple eight days after birth.

Everybody is named according to the day he or she is born, and a family name is added. So the first name is the day your are born and the family name is implicitly your surname or second

Those born on Monday are called Kodwo/Kojo and Adwoa/Adwowa for male and female respectively; Tuesday - Kobena (male) and Abena (female); Wednesday -Kweku (male) and Ekua/Eduwa (female); Thursday -Yaw/Kwaw (male) and Aba/Yaa (female); Friday -Kofi (male) and Efua/Efuwa (female); Saturday -Kwame/Kwamena (male) and Ama/Amba (female); Sunday - Kwesi (male) and Esi (female). (Some of the names are shortened as I have indicated).

The first born is normally named after the child's grandfather; the father of the child's father. The second born is named after the mother's father or any important immediate family member living or dead. All other children are named after any important person the parents want to name them after, but mostly not outside the family or clan. The child can also be named after a very good friend.

Names are very important because it is believed that the child would take after the life of the one named after; or the spirit of the one named after would guide the child. Thus, those who did not or do not live good lives lose the privilege of having somebody named after them.

If a child is named after the chief or queen mother or the elder of the family or a very important member; usually the actual name of the child is not used alone when called but qualified with a term like Maame, Papa, Nana, Wofa, (Mother, Father Grand, Uncle, etc.)

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH **Matrimony In the Order of Creation**

God who created man out of love also calls him to love--the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being. For man is created in the image and likeness of God who is himself love. Since God created him man and woman, their mutual love becomes an image of the absolute and unfailing love with which God loves man. It is good, very good, in the Creator's eyes. And this love which God blesses is intended to be fruitful and to be realized in the common work of watching over creation: "And God blessed them, and God said to them: 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue

Holy Scripture affirms that man and woman were created for one another: "It is not good that the man should be alone." The woman, "flesh of his flesh," his equal, his nearest in all things, is given to him by God as a "helpmate"; she thus represents God from whom comes our help. "Therefore a man leaves his father and mother and cleaves to his wife, and they become one flesh." The Lord himself shows that this signifies an unbreakable union of their two lives by recalling what the plan of the Creator had been "in the beginning": "So they are not longer two, but one flesh."
