Policies and Procedures

Welcome

On behalf of the faculty and staff at Summit Dance Academy, welcome. We know what an important decision it is to choose the right environment for your child, and we are thrilled to share our programs and vision with you this year. At Summit, your child is our top priority. You can expect your student to receive quality attention, the opportunity to advance, and tools vital for success in and out of the classroom. Your child will not only grow as a dancer, but will also learn valuable life skills including teamwork, self-discipline, time management, and how to build life-long friendships.

What type of commitment is expected?

Participating in a program at Summit is a 40-week commitment. Classes begin on August 20, 2018 and will continue through June 4, 2019. To best support your child's training, CONSISTENT ATTENDANCE IS REQUIRED. Attendance is crucial for your child to progress. Please inform the office of any absence by phone or email within 48 hours of the absence. In order to supplement absences, make-up classes are strongly recommended. Information regarding make-up classes can be found in our Policies and Procedures included in your orientation packet. Please note that you will remain responsible for payment regardless of your child's attendance. Information regarding tuition and fees can be found in the Tuition and Fees section of this brochure.

Is there a dress code?

Yes! Detailed information can be found in each dance styles section of this brochure. Each age group will be assigned a different color for girls, and all male students will be required to wear blank pants and a white or black shirt.

How do I know in which level my child should be placed?

All current SDA dancers will receive class placements to help facilitate registering at the proper level. New to SDA, we can help you decide on placement based on your students age and dance experience. Please rest assured that your child's class placement and progress will be monitored and adjusted accordingly in order to accommodate his/her growth and development. Please trust the Teachers and the Directors. We are professionals and care about your child. We want him/her to enjoy dance for many years to come.

Heather Webb Jasso is Summit Dance Academy's Co-Artistic Director and Team Director. Mrs. Jasso is also a third-generation dance teacher and studio owner. She was dancing before she could walk; and, aside from training with her mother, aunts, and grandparents (New York City Ballet), she has had the opportunity to travel and study under the dance "greats," Joe Tremaine, Brian Freidman, Tabitha, Mia Michaels, Terry Beaman, Dee Caspary, Wes Veldink, and David Scott. She has also performed key roles in ballets such as the Nutcracker, Snow White, Cinderella, and the Twelve Dancing Princesses. Heather is a title-winning dancer and choreographer at the regional and national level, winning numerous awards such as multiple FDC Judges' Choice Awards, the Prime

Time Scholarship Award, and World Dance Championship Invites in 2009 and 2011. Furthermore, she was awarded the Pulse Tour's Teacher Scholarship in 2009 and was invited to compete in America's Got Talent auditions in 2010. Heather was awarded Teacher of the Year in Panama City, Florida in 2011. Heather has also traveled the country and been an adjudicator for national dance competitions for 2013-2017. This last fall Ms. Webb Jasso was invited to adjudicate for Australia's Get The Beat International Competition. Ms. Webb Jasso is so excited to invite you and your dancer to come share her passion for dance!



Ashley M. Calligan is Summit Dance Academy's Co-Artistic Director and Ballet Director. Mrs.Calligan is from Denver, Colorado and has been teaching ballet for 18 years. Mrs. Calligan trained at The Academy of Colorado Ballet, The Academy of Russian Ballet, and Burklyn Ballet Theatre. While dancing, she performed numerous roles including; Lilac Fairy in The Sleeping Beauty, Soloist in Paquita, Spanish in The Nutcracker, and many original works by Elizabeth Shipiatsky, Robert Royce, Angela Whitehill, and Thom Clower. For the 2008-2009 season she was the Ballet Mistress with Western Arkansas Ballet of Fort Smith, Arkansas. She is currently in her 17th year as

the Assistant to the Artistic Director and Ballet Mistress with Burklyn Ballet Theatre, under the direction of Joanne Whitehill. With Burklyn Ballet Theatre, she has traveled numerous times to Scotland to perform in The Edinburgh Festival Fringe. For the past three years, she has produced and directed her own full-length production of The Nutcracker. Her students have gone on to dance professionally and to dance in college dance programs such as Suny Purchase College, The University of Arizona, and The University of Oklahoma. As Co-Owner of Summit Dance Academy she is looking forward to inspiring her students and building a studio that that will continue to thrive in years to come!



Kelly Amadeo is Summit Dance Academy's Children's Program Director. Kelly has an extensive background in child and adolescent development, education, and dance instruction. Kelly is a licensed teacher in the state of Colorado, has a bachelor's degree in childhood education, and a master's degree in elementary education. She danced and performed at the advanced level at Colorado State University while obtaining her degrees. Kelly was trained in the Russian Ballet Technique and is knowledgeable about a variety of styles and schools of dance. Her areas of specialty included pas de deux, pointe, ballet, and children's dance. Kelly studied dance at Ballet Northwest, Perry-

Mansfield, Colorado State University, and Colorado Ballet. She was also a company member of a traveling dance company that taught elementary students around the western states about the history of dance. Kelly has performed lead roles in The Firebird, Nutcracker, Sleeping Beauty, Cinderella, Dracula, Beauty and the Beast, Robin Hood, and many others in her 30 years of dance. She has choreographed and directed dance productions including the Nutcracker. Her pedagogy of dance education is that all children can master skills in dance to build a solid foundation for a lifetime of dance through fun, safe, consistent, and structured education. She encourages students and parents to build respectful relationships with each other and their instructors to create a safe and enjoyable environment for all.



Susan Beens is Summit Dance Academy's Tumbling, Strength, Fitness Director and teaches tumbling at Parker Performing Arts school. Ms. Fitness USA 2009. She is a Colorado native, but spent time in Nashville getting her undergraduate degree in business. While in Nashville, she opened a gymnastics facility. She trained a level 10 gymnast to the national championships, level 8s and 9s to state and regional championships, and had several TOPS national qualifiers. Susan also worked with a handful of junior fitness competitors and took them to local and national level shows. She has been teaching tumbling and acro for dance, along with strength and flexibility for many years. She was a competitive gymnast, stopping at level 9. Susan also trained in ballet, jazz, and lyrical at The Durango Ballet Academy.

Cricket Keller started dancing in her mom's studio in New Mexico under the instruction of her mother at the age of three. After Cricket graduated high school she moved straight to Los Angeles, CA where she auditioned for and received a scholarship to study commercial dance at the EDGE Performing Arts Center. In 2010 Cricket and her husband moved to Colorado after their daughter was born to be closer to family. Some of Cricket's dancing credits include re-occurring performances as a featured American Bandstand dancer on NBC's "American Dreams", playing a cheerleader in the Hillary Duff movie "A Cinderella Story", and performing live at the American

Music Awards for pop artist Pink and choreographer Marty Kudelka. She was an original cast member as an aerialist / underwater soloist for the stunt show "Mystic Rhythms" at Tokyo Disney Sea, a beloved show which only recently closed after running for fourteen years. Cricket is an experienced adjudicator for dance festivals and competitions, has taught master classes throughout the U.S. and Canada, and has over fifteen years experience teaching dance and working as a choreographer. Cricket received her Bachelor of Arts in World Arts and Cultures from UCLA in 2008.



Jordan Lefton, a native of West Palm Beach, Florida, graduated from Alexander W. Dreyfoos School of the Arts and The Juilliard School. Jordan joined James Sewell Ballet in Minneapolis soon after graduation from college and spent three seasons with the company. Over the years, Jordan has trained in ballet, among many other techniques including Limón, Horton, Gaga, Graham, contemporary partnering, contact improvisation, and tap. He has worked with many talented teachers and choreographers including Lawrence Rhodes, Risa Steinberg, Lar Lubovitch, Troy Powell, Andra Corvino, Francisco Martinez, Alphonse Poulin, Loni Landon, and Larry

Keigwin. Jordan enjoys teaching and has done so for the past 9 years. He plans to keep spreading the art of dance to as many people as possible.



Lynsey McMullen grew up in Colorado and began dancing in her mother, Marilyn Long's, dance studio at the age of three. She was the youngest dancer accepted into the prestigious Bolshoi Ballet intensive in Vail where she performed for former President Gerald Ford. She studied at The Academy of Colorado Ballet under Elizabeth Shipiatsky and Zhanna Dubrovskaya, receiving several scholarships from the Denver Ballet Guild. In high school, Ms. McMullen was selected by renowned Hollywood choreographer/director/actor, Debbie Allen as dance captain for the Kennedy Center Imagination Celebration's production of Pepito's Story. She received her BA in

dance with an emphasis in performance and choreography from University of Northern Colorado studying under Molly Faulkner and Monte Black, and performed with the UNC dance team, the Sugar Bears. After college, Ms. McMullen relocated to Chicago where she was a member of Chicago Dance Crash performing in works choreographed by Mouse McCray and Kyle Vincent Terry. Favorite roles have included Snow Queen in The Nutcracker, Pas de Trois in Paquita, and the Abuelos Pas de Deux in Miranda's Nightmare. Ms. McMullen has also coached poms/jazz teams at the varsity level. She currently resides in Parker, CO with her husband and two children. In 2015, she achieved her lifelong goal of competing on Jeopardy.



Kayla Scott was born and raised in Aurora, CO. She began dancing at the age of fourteen on her high school hip hop team. From there she began to teach at the age of seventeen and has not stopped since. She now runs her own competitive dance crew COhe One Motive with her Co-direct Jonah Buckley. They are the largest competitive adult dance crew in Colorado. All members are held to the highest of training standards and are teaching through out the Colorado Dance community.

Mini Program Ages 3 - 8

These classes are specifically designed for children 8 years of age and younger. The focus is on the pre-stages of ballet as well as stressing the quality of movement, rhythm, and creativity. The primary purpose of this program is not only to provide proper training, but moreover to develop a love for the movement of dance.
