#### PAGE 2 A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

I am continually troubled by what constitutes "news" in our country. There are so many deeply troubling issues facing our world today and yet our news streams are filled with distractions that keep us from looking at the real problems that face our world regarding famine, poverty, war, disease, climate change etc... Some of the more troubling topics that continue to grab headlines year after year regard the LGBTQ communities. I bring this up because the bulk of attacks lobbed against the LGBTQ community come from people who are leaders within the Christian Community or claim to have a strong Christian influence in their life. So in response to numerous inflammatory statements and actions that people continue to lob at the LGBTQ communities I would like to make my position definitively clear: I do not, nor have I ever believed God cares about your sexual or gender preference as long as you are not actively trying to hurt another person.

I can point to several key moments in my life that have solidified this belief—here are two primary ones. The first was when my cousin came out as being gay. After watching her go through two failed marriages and a string of careers as she struggled to find happiness by making others happy meanwhile denying who she was, she finally found contentment. Since coming out she has not led a perfect life, but she has led a happy life. The second one was when I did volunteer work in Mexico. Over half of the people I worked with on these mission trips were from the LGBTQ community and as we worked those long hot days under the Mexican sun building homes, and a drug treatment center, we were all Christians nothing more, nothing less, just imperfect children of God looking to Glorify Christ by helping out those in need. Rather than being people who should be shamed or forced into being people they are not, these were beacons of light who helped myself and many others grow closer to God.

This is why I am proud that Burke is part of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church of America) because we are part of one of the largest Christian organizations in the United States and we openly love and support the LGBTQ communities throughout the US. While the vast majority of Christian bodies throughout the US have made similar statements it saddens me that it is the loud negative voices that continue to get all the press wasting millions of dollars hurting people and spreading anger rather than focusing those vast resources and time on issues that are truly causing harm and need more attention if they are ever going to be solved. In the Bible there are seven verses that could be argued address the LGBTQ community yet none of them address anyone in those communities in healthy relationships that we see all around us (just call me if you would like to debate this), there are over a hundred passages directly addressing God's call for us to help those in need, and another hundred plus verses asking us to practice forgiveness and not to Judge. What do you think Jesus thought was more important for us to spend our time and energy on? Let's please stop attacking people for who they choose to love or who to be, especially when those choices do not deliberately attack or hurt others and instead get to doing what we are called to do, spreading the love of Christ through word and deed.

# From the pages of Our Good Cooks, 150 Years in the Garden of Eatin', Burke Lutheran Church

#### THREE STEP SALAD

- -1/2 cup sliced almonds
- 3 T sugar
- 6 cups torn romaine lettuce
- 1 (11 oz) can mandarin oranges
- 1 cup sliced celery ettuce - 3 green onions (sliced)
- \_ .
- Dressing: ½ cup vegetable oil
- ¼ cup vinegar
- -2 to 3 T sugar
- ½ tsp salt
  ½ tsp ground mustard
- -1/4 tsp garlic powder



In small saucepan over medium heat cook and stir almonds and sugar until almonds are coated and slightly browned (about 4 minutes). Spread almonds on foil to cook, break apart. In large bowl combine ro-

maine, drained oranges, celery and onions. Top with almonds. In a jar with tight lid combine the dressing ingredients, shake well. Pour over the salad and toss gently. Makes 8 servings. *Recipe by Virginia Steward*

# DOG DAYS OF SUMMER

Why Are They Called the "Dog Days" of Summer?

The days in July and August, often referred to as the "dog days of summer" are some of the hottest in the Northern Hemisphere. Many people believe that the phrase comes from the idea that dogs tend to be sluggish during the hottest



days of the year-aren't we all?

But the name actually dates back thousands of years and is based on the movement of the stars.

It is thought that the ancient Greeks and Romans coined the term in reference to the star, Sirius, the brightest star visible from any part of earth and part of the constellation Canis Major, the Greater Dog. Sirius is also referred to as the Dog Star, and it rises and sets with the sun starting in late July and ending in mid August.

The position of the stars was a fundamental part of ancient life, which shaped religious beliefs, marked seasons, and helped navigation.

The ancient Romans even believed that the star actually gave off heat and added to the Sun's warmth, accounting for the long stretch of sultry weather. While this time is usually the hottest part of summer, the heat is not due to any added radiation from Sirius, regardless of how bright it is. The heat of summer is simply a result of the Earth's tilt. During summer in the Northern Hemisphere, the tilt of the Earth causes the Sun's rays to hit at a more direct angle, and for a longer period of time throughout the day. This means longer, hotter days. So plan that beach vacation!
