Greenbush Township Board Meeting

The regular meeting of the Greenbush Township Board was held the 3rd of June 2013 at 7:00PM. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Jim Jorae and the Pledge of Allegiance followed. All board members were present.

Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the agenda, Julie Havens supported and the motion carried.

Minutes from the May 20-13 board meeting were read. Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Julie Havens supported and the motion carried.

The Treasurers report was read. The balances on May 31st, 2013 were:

Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the report as read, supported by Bernadette Hayes and it carried. Bill Dershem made a motion to transfer \$11,416.10 to pay orders 764 through 781 and to pay the Consumers bill for the Eureka Street lights, estimated at \$350, when it comes, Bernadette Hayes supported and the motion carried.

Public comment came from Jean Bradley concerning the website, checks and balances and fire permits, Jim Whitford on traffic through Eureka, and road conditions, Gloria Dunkel on traffic through Eureka and Sarah Zamarron on traffic through Eureka.

Eric Thompson from the Clinton County Sheriff Department reports car/deer accidents are up, a meth lab was shut down in Maple Rapids, and he will talk to his supervisor about potentially scheduling patrols through Eureka.

Tom Lewis, Assistant Chief with CAFR was in attendance and introduced himself.

Assessor Gail Watkins says the tax bills will go out soon. Greenbush Township is about 3% of the total value in Clinton County.

County Commissioner Kam Washburn reports the new animal shelter construction will begin after the exercise area for the inmates is complete, expansion of Motz Park is under consideration, Obama Care is going to require another layer of administration and will go into effect in January.

Joe Pulver from the Road Commission spoke about the conditions, funding, matching funds, and maintenance and potential projects. If the millage passes we will meet to formulate a 3 year plan.

Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the contract from Clinton County Road Commission for one application of dust control for an estimated \$10,360, Julie Havens second the motion; the motion carried.

Julie Havens made a motion to adjourn at 8:40PM, Bill Dershem supported and the motion carried.
