Mail Thefts

A resident recently reported theft of outgoing mail from one of the Villas Mail Box Units (MBU). Willful damage to mailboxes or theft of mail are Federal crimes (felonies), punishable by fine or imprisonment or both.

The only way to successfully steal mail from an MBU is for the mailman to have left the door open, unlocked (an error that sometimes occurs) or a thief to use a sticky substance and remove whatever pieces they can pull out from the narrow slot in the door. To open an MBU requires a special Arrow Key, which only the Post Office has. They are checked out in the morning and turned in at night, rarely lost. It is possible for loss to occur somewhere else further on along the line. It is nearly impossible to solve these problems.

THE BEST WAY TO AVOID THEFT- take outgoing mail to the Post Office and deposit it INSIDE. Do Not leave mail in a collection box, anywhere, any time.

If you believe you have been the victim of mail theft, recommended action includes filing a police report and reporting the suspected theft to the United States Postal Inspection Services on line at <u>https://postalinspectors.uspis.gov/</u> or by phone at 1-877-876-2455 (press option 3).

Patio Drains



With the considerable amount of rainfall and winds we have experienced lately, we would like to take the opportunity to remind residents whose homes include an interior atrium/patio that it is vitally important to be vigilant about keeping your atrium/patio drain clear. Do not cover it and be sure it is not clogged with leaves or other debris.

Raised drain covers that fit the opening can be purchased at a local hardware store. This drain cover can prevent both you and your neighbors a lot of heartache and expense, as any water that seeps into your neighbors' walls *is your financial responsibility to repair.*

Please take this simple step to protect your, and your neighbors, property.

Irvine residents can get 10 free prefilled sandbags at the City's Operations Support Facility, 6427 Oak Canyon Road, Irvine. Please check in at the front office; staff will direct you to the sandbag pickup area. Be prepared to show proof of Irvine residency prior to picking up your bags.

Public Works staff is available to assist during the following hours: Monday-Thursday 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Friday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.; closed Saturday and Sunday.

Please Don't Feed the Wildlife

Feeding a wild animal may seem harmless, but feeding wildlife can have serious effects for both the animals and humans.



- "People" food isn't good for animals. It can cause disease, mouth and throat injuries to the animal and even death.
- Feeding wildlife can make them dependent on humans as a source of food and they may become unable to survive on their own.
- Wild animals can lose their natural fear of people once they become used to humans feeding them. It puts people at risk and they can become a nuisance.
- Wild animals can be unpredictable. A wild animal may see people, including children, as a threat and may attack to defend itself.
- Leaving food on the sidewalk or common area for a rabbit, squirrel or duck, can have unintended results - attracting coyotes, bobcats, or rats.

Preventative Measures

In addition to atrium/patio drain covers and sandbags, *remove standing water*. Don't allow pools of standing water to form near your home. These preventative efforts will go a long way toward ensuring a safe environment for you and your neighbors.

As a gentle reminder, per our Residence Guide, holiday lights should be removed by the end of January. If you still have lights up, please take them down and store until next year. Thanks!

Feeding Wildlife / Bird feeders

The Villas has seen an increase in the number of rodents in the area. Please do not leave food outside for wildlife, as it draws these pests, which can be difficult and expensive to remove.

While birdfeeders don't necessarily attract mice/rats/squirrels, they can make their presence more visible. Birdfeeders should be maintained and hung within the confines of your patio – not in the common area.

- Keep feed off the ground
- For seeds and nuts, use feeders they can't access:
 - A freestanding pole with a baffle will block climbing animals
 - A hanging dome baffle will protect feeders hanging from trees
 - Weight-sensitive feeders shut out rodents. Most window feeders are safe from rodents

Tree Trimming

Great Scott Tree Service is the contractor used by the Villas for our tree trimming needs. All employees are Wildlife Certified and proactively observe Great Scott's Bird Protection Policy. Trees with active nests will be tagged and will not be trimmed until after the birds are gone.

Saucers/Risers Under Plants

Potted plants are a great way to bring color to your patio, but without proper drainage, the water from them can rot the top surface of your patio wall. Use saucers or, better yet, elevate your plants with pot risers so the surface can properly dry out. Even an inch or two of space gives the shelf a chance to dry out between waterings and saves it from rot or expensive repair. Damage to the surface caused by your plants would be the responsibility of the homeowner and can easily be avoided

Recycling centers are operating more efficiently than ever. However, certain "offenders" can slow down the process or contaminate the load. You can help by keeping these items out of the bin.

Do Not Recycle:

- Loose plastic bags and film
 - Plastic shopping bags
 - Bagged recyclables keep recyclables loose in the cart
 - Plastic storage bags
 - Plastic stretch wrap and film
- Food waste
 - o Food scraps
 - Food-soiled containers
 - Soiled paper products
- Polystyrene foam cups or containers
 - o Egg cartons
 - o Packing popcorn
 - Take-out containers
 - o Drinking cups

Also, do not include...

- Needles or medical waste
- Plastic utensils
- Fast food packaging
- Shredded paper
- Broken / sharp glass
- Shower curtains
- Hoses
- Ceramic materials
- Cloth / clothing
- Hazardous items e.g. paints, oil, batteries, fluorescent bulbs
- Engine blocks
- Used tire

Summer's well on its way, and with the hot weather comes the need for a refreshing swim. It's highly beneficial for you, as the homeowner, to know the Villas rules of usage and your responsibilities to friends/family taking advantage of the community swimming pool!

Please take a moment to review The Villas Pool Rules. These rules are posted on the bulletin board and are also listed in the Residents Guide. The rules allow for an enjoyable experience by everyone. Although they can sometimes seem restrictive, pool rules are there to ensure the health and safety of every pool visitor.

- When you enjoy the community pool, be a good neighbor. Obey posted rules.
- Don't bring electric devices around the pool. Water and electricity don't mix this can be dangerous around the pool.
- If you would like to listen to music, be courteous and use earbuds – not everyone likes, or wants, to listen to your music.
- Don't hold conversations on your cell phone at the pool. Voices carry around the water and can disturb other pool users. Your conversations should stay private.
- Respect pool hours. Neighbors who live close by may not enjoy your late-night foray into the hot tub or pool.

Villas pool hours are:

Sunday-Thursday: 6:00 am – 10:00 pm Friday-Saturday: 6:00 am – 11:00 pm Infractions of the pool rules may be, and should be, acted upon by any adult resident by politely advising the offending party of the infraction. Continued disregard of the rules may be reported to the Villas property management company for follow-up.

Please remember that a sense of community pride and a spirit of cooperation can ensure the pool will be an area of relaxation for everyone.

Storage Closets

Recently we've had a few occurrences of tampering with resident's storage units. Please remember that storage closets are available on a first-come, first-served basis. In the Villas, there is not a storage unit for each address, so please limit your use to one closet only so that as many homeowners as possible have access to storage.

If you become aware of an empty closet, you may use it, with the exception of utility closets.

Utility closets may <u>not</u> be used for any storage. Any items found stored in a utility closet are subject to disposal.

If you see anyone tampering with the lock on a storage unit, please report it immediately to Optimum Professional Property Management. Thank you.

Newspaper/Flyer Distributions

Small things can make a difference, and the appearances of safety are extremely important. Removing unwanted newspapers and flyers from in front of your garage or home can help in deterring vandalism and keeping our community safe.

We have no control over delivery of these items; they can be distributed, even if a "No Soliciting" sign is posted, so long as they don't knock on your door

Items that pile up in front of your home or get blown into the bushes can signal that your home may be unoccupied and may be seen as an invitation for vandalism.

Let's work together to keep our community safe and beautiful by clearing publications away.



Reporting/Fixing Leaks in your Unit

It is very important to deal with water leaks quickly because damage resulting from damp and other associated problems can be extensive.

The first thing to do is to find the cause of the leak and what immediate action is required to stop it.

You are responsible for all plumbing outlets and fixtures in your home as well as any water pipes that have been replaced in your unit, so it's likely any leak will come from a pipe you own and is your responsibility to fix. You should call a qualified plumber and have any leak repaired as soon as possible. Should your plumber find the leak is coming from a communal pipe, you should advise Optimum Professional Property Management, Inc. immediately. Quick action when dealing with water leaks can help avoid extensive damage and remediation costs.

Shopping Carts:

Did you know... Removal of shopping carts from a store parking lot is prohibited by state law?

Please do not bring carts on or next to the Villas property and abandon them. Bringing grocery carts back to the Community creates an eyesore, blocks walkways, clutters alleyways, and sometimes blocks dumpsters hindering trash pick-up. You can be charged with a misdemeanor because it is AGAINST THE LAW!

Inexpensive, collapsible, folding shopping carts can be purchased if you have a need for a personal cart to bring your groceries home.

We have had several occurrences of carts being left at the pedestrian gate at Culver Drive as well as other areas within the community. If you are aware of someone bringing carts to the Villas, please remind them that it is not allowed.
