**Outlook:** Tragedy struck the Trojans in July, when starting center Garrett Bennett died in a car accident. Å"The talk among the players has been to win [the state title] for Bennett,Å" says coach Allan Trimble. Å"TheyÅ've decided theyÅ're going to play for him, and I think thatÅ's noble.Å" Ginther threw for 1,664 yards and 19 touchdowns last year, while Adkins ran for 724 yards and seven scores. Jenks is stacked on defense with Shuck (four-year starter), Gillespie (bench-presses 365 pounds) and senior defensive backs Dial (committed to Arkansas), Devin Reed and P.J. Adeji-Paul.
