From now through December 2027, women who are CURRENTLY SERVING ON ACTIVE DUTY in the U.S. Armed Forces, both regular and reserve

components to include the National Guard, can join MWAN as a new member for \$10 per year, when they pay for five years in advance. Even those who choose to join for one year can do so for \$20; almost half the regular new-member cost. This special Active-Duty Membership includes a free T-shirt and an E-MAIL subscription to *Military Women's Bulletin*, which is published six times per year.

The special application for this promotion is on Page 7 of this bulletin. Print copies now and start recruiting! Even if you don't have a nearby military installation, active-duty military women may be found nationwide in recruiting offices, national guard facilities and reserve centers.

This promotion is designed to attract new members to our organization, so the offer is NOT available to current and former MWAN or WAVES National members. Additionally, this special pricing may only be used once by new members on active duty during the promotion, regardless of whether the single-year or five-year option is selected.

Upon request, new member active-duty applicants must be able to show their active-duty military identification card, orders or other military service documentation showing their current active-duty service.

My name is Barbara "Barb" Turner, and I enlisted in the Navy in November 1974. After bootcamp at RTC Orlando. Florida, I was assigned to HTtraining a helicopter 18. squadron, at NAS Whiting Field, Milton, Florida. As an undesignated sailor, I began training as an aircrewman on the squadron's 72 H-1 Huey helicopters. I successfully completed my training in half the time it took my fellow (male)

sailors and earned my Wings of Gold in 1976, just before I headed to school to become an "AZ" or Aviation Maintenance Administrationman.

I met and married my husband Ben in Sigonella, Sicily, in 1978 and we have three wonderful sons, along with two amazing daughters-in-law, five granddaughters and one grandson.

I climbed the ranks to Senior Chief prior to being selected as a Limited Duty Officer (LDO). I then swapped roles with my husband: He took shore duty so I could go to sea.

While assigned to HC-6 at NAS Norfolk, Virginia, I joined the crews of two CH-46 helicopters on three separate deployments to the Mediterranean. Other than having to leave my family behind, it was a wonderful experience.

I served as Detachment Aviation Maintenance Officer onboard the USS Butte and the USS Santa Barbara, both ammunition ships. I transferred to, and retired from, Naval Aviation Schools Command onboard NAS Pensacola, FL in November 1996 after serving twenty-two wonderful years.

I joined WAVES National (WN) in 1995 and served in numerous offices including unit president, WN Public

We are a "blue star" family, and my stepdaughter currently serves as a captain in the US Air Force.

We live in a Houston suburb with our two Beagles.

# Healthcare coverage at non-VA facilities

If you use VA healthcare regularly as I do (I declined Medicare Part B) here is some potentially vital information.

Should you go to a non-VA emergency room/department for a genuine emergency (life-threatening) situation, the VA will likely pick up the tab, BUT you MUST notify Fee Basis/Community Care within 72 hours. You or a family member can call (844)724-7242 or use the website, which is <u>https://emergencycarereporting.communitycare.va.gov</u>

It is NOT sufficient to just tell the hospital staff when you check in. You or a family member MUST contact them.

However, definitely tell the hospital staff about your VA connection, because the VA may want to transfer you to a VA facility.

If your situation is urgent, but NOT a life-threatening emergency, and you need an urgent care provider, you will likely be covered\* by the Mission Act. I recommend you call (833) 483-8699 NOW to verify whether you are eligible for urgent care services under the Mission Act.

The Mission Act provides eligible veterans with three visits per year, which are FREE or low-cost. If you are prescribed medication, you may also get that medication free from a participating pharmacy.

There is no "insurance card" for these benefits, but you MUST use a participating provider and tell that provider and the pharmacy that you are a qualified veteran using the Mission Act.

- 1. Must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 2. Must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 3. Entries must be submitted by 18 April 2022: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 4. Military women and veterans MAY NOT APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP.

## Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

1. Completed Application.

2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.

# NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security numbers on high school or college transcripts.

3. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the above topic. The essay must be the applicant's own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence (including a bibliography) of both research and <u>an interview with at least one military woman</u>. Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.

4. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include **separate attachments** for the following:

- (1) Completed Application
- (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
- (3) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.
