



# Thanksgiving

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. (Matt. 6:9-10) As an ambassador of Christ (2 Cor. 5:20), abiding in Christ (John 15:4-5, John 6:56) and one with Him (John 17:22), we come into agreement with our Father in heaven (Matt. 6:9), the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17) and the Word of Life (1 John 1:1). In Him who is true (1 John 5:20), Jesus Christ, we give thanks to the Lord, the living God, the true God, the everlasting King (Jer. 10:10), our righteous Father (John 17:25), for you and your family, for the saints, for the leaders that God has raised up on your behalf and for all men (1 Tim. 2:1-2). As a vessel of mercy, so that Christ might make known to you the riches of His glory, we go up into the gaps to stand in battle on the day of the Lord, to build a wall for you and your house (Ezek. 13:5); for all the brethren, all those called by the name of the Lord; for the leaders of this nation, and all the leaders throughout the world, all those that influence the well-being of God's people; all the people of this nation, and all men, so that you and your family may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. (1 Tim. 2:1-2) In the name of Jesus Christ, we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God (Is. 61:2). We stand, and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God! (Rom. 5:2) It is written (Matt. 4:4), the things that we speak (Jer. 1:7) and pray for you and your family (James 5:16), for these words are true and faithful (Rev. 21:5), and they are the true sayings of God (Rev. 19:9). The word of God is true (John 3:33), pure (Prov. 30:5, Ps. 119:140), proven (Ps. 18:30), , and eternal, for heaven and earth will pass away, but God's word will by no means pass away (Matt. 24:35); it is living, and powerful (Heb. 4:12); it searches the hearts of man (Rev. 2:23), like a two edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart (Heb. 4:12), and nothing is hidden from His sight (Heb. 4:13), the Mighty One (Ps. 45:3), the Ancient of Days (Dan. 7:9), the Holy one of Israel (Is. 5:24). The words that Christ, through us, speaks to you and your family are spirit, and they are life. (John 6:63) Thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through your Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 15:57)

As a vessel of ministry (Heb. 9:21), abiding in God and abiding in His love (1 John 4:16), we lift up you and your entire house, all of your family, all of your

blood from the beginning of time until the end of time, all those by adoption, and all those by marriage, all your natural seed and all of your spiritual seed. Out of the depths of our heart we have cried to You, O Lord; Lord, hear our voice! Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of our supplications. (Ps. 130:1-2) Save Your people, and bless Your inheritance; shepherd them also, and bear them up forever. (Ps. 28:9) Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace always in every way. The Lord be with you all. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. (2 Thess. 3:16-18) In the name of Jesus, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of throne of God (Heb. 12:2), in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that the Lord God will remember you and your house with the favor He has toward His people; and visit you with His salvation, that you may see the benefit of His chosen ones, that you may rejoice in the gladness of His nation, that you may glory with his inheritance. (Ps. 106: 4-5) Oh, give thanks to the Lord! Call upon His name; make known His deeds among your people! Sing to Him, sing psalms to Him; talk of all His wondrous works! Glory in His holy name; let your hearts rejoice who seek the Lord! Seek the Lord and His strength; seek His face evermore! Remember His marvelous works which He has done, His wonders and the judgments of His mouth. O seed of God, His servants, His children, His chosen ones! (1 Chr. 16:8-13). Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever (1 Chr. 16:34). You are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you and your people out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Pet. 2:9); chosen by God and precious (1 Pet. 2:4), a special treasure to God (Ex. 19:5). You and your house have been designated by name to give thanks to the Lord (1 Chr. 16:41), to stand every morning to commemorate, thank and praise the Lord God of Israel (1 Chr. 16:4), and likewise at evening (1 Chr. 23:30). May the God of your salvation gather you and your family together, and deliver you, so that you will give thanks to His holy name, and triumph in His praise (1 Chr. 16:35). Let you and your house give thanks to the Lord your God, and sing praises to His name; for He is the tower of your salvation, and shows mercy to you, His anointed, and to your descendants forevermore. (2 Sam. 22:50-51). Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting to everlasting (1 Chr. 16:36).

Oh come, let us sing to the Lord! Let us shout joyfully to the Rock of our salvation, and come before His presence with thanksgiving; let us shout joyfully to Him (Ps. 95:1-2). The Lord by wisdom founded the earth; by understanding He established the heavens. (Prov. 3:19) The earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein. (Ps. 24:1) For the Lord is the great God, the God of gods, the Lord of lords (Duet. 10:17), the King (Rev. 17:16), who is head of all principalities and powers (Col. 2:10). In His hand are the deep places of the earth; the heights of the hills are His also. The sea is His, for He made it; and His hands formed the dry land. Oh come, let you worship and bow down; let you kneel before the Lord your Maker. For He is your God, and you are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand. Today, if you and yours will hear His voice: Do not harden your hearts, as in the rebellion. (Ps. 95:4-8) Make a joyful shout to the Lord! Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing. Know that the Lord, He is God; it is He who has made you, and not you yourselves; you are His people and the sheep of His pasture. (Ps. 100:1-3) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, who abolished death, and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel (2 Tim. 1:10), that you and yours will hear the voice of Jesus, and He will know you and you will follow Him. And He will give you and yours eternal life, and you shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch you out of His hand. The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you to Him, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch you out of His hand (John 10:27-29). God has lovingly delivered your soul from the pit of corruption, for He has cast all your sins behind His back. (Is. 38:17) For He made Jesus who knew no sin to be sin for you, that you might become the righteousness of God in Him (2 Cor. 5:21); for the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses you and your house from all sin. (1 John 1:7) He remembers His covenant forever, the word which He commanded for a thousand generations. (Ps. 105:8) For in death there is no remembrance of God; in the grave who will give God thanks? (Ps. 6:5) For Sheol cannot thank Him, death cannot praise Him; those who go down to the pit cannot hope for His truth. (Is. 38:18) Lift up your eyes to the heavens, for His salvation is forever, and His righteousness will not be abolished. (Is. 51:6) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house will give thanks to the Lord Most High, and sing praises to His name; to declare His loving-kindness in the morning, and His faithfulness every night. (Ps. 92:2-3)

Now thanks be to God who always leads you and your house in triumph in Christ, and through you diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place. (2 Cor. 2:14) For you and your people are to God the fragrance of Christ (2 Cor. 2:15-15), the aroma of life (2 Cor. 2:16). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we give thanks for you and your house, making mention of you in our prayers; that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you and your house the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in you and your house, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward you and your house who believe, according to the working of His mighty power. (Eph. 1:15-19) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your people be followers of God as dear children. And walk in love, as Christ also has loved you and given Himself for you, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma (Eph. 5:1-2). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray for you and your house, and ask our Father in Heaven, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for you, that He might purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works (Titus 2:14). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you and yours may have a walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; giving thanks to the Father who has qualified you and yours to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has delivered you and your house from the power of darkness and translated you into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom you have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. (Col. 1:9-14) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house will rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you (1 Thess. 5:16-18). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we implore you and your people, do not quench the Spirit (1 Thess. 5:19), but test all things; hold fast what is good, and abstain from every form of evil. (1 Thess. 5:21-22) Let fornication and all uncleanness or covetousness not be named among you, neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor coarse jesting, but rather giving of thanks. (Eph. 5:3-4) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we thank God, whom we serve with a pure conscience (2 Tim. 1:3), that we may be filled with joy (2 Tim. 1:4), because of the

genuine faith that is in you and your house (2 Tim. 1:5). May you and your people not be lovers of yourselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having a form of godliness but denying its power. And, in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray, from such people you and your family turn away! (2 Tim. 3:2-5) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and yours will not be drunk with wine; but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of your Lord Jesus Christ (Eph. 5:18-20). Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, from whom there is no variation or shadow of turning. (James 1:17) Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you and your people completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Thess. 5:23) May our God and Father Himself, and our Lord Jesus Christ, make you and your house increase and abound in love to one another and to all, so that He may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of your Lord Jesus Christ with all His saints. (1 Thess. 3:11-13). And we thank Christ Jesus, our Lord, who has enabled you and yours (1 Tim. 1:12), and in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we thank God always for you and your house, because your faith grows exceedingly, and the love of every one of you abounds toward each other and all (2 Thess. 1:3). Let us proclaim with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all God's wondrous works. (Ps. 26:7)

In the name of Jesus, He who is able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him (Heb. 7:25), in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house will consecrate yourselves to the Lord, come near, and bring sacrifices and thank offerings into the house of the Lord with a willing heart (2 Chr.29-31). May you not be deceived by those that although they know God, they do not glorify Him as God, they are not thankful, but become futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts are darkened. Professing to be wise, they are fools. (Rom. 1:21-22) Instead, may the fire of the Lord Jesus Christ be kindled in your hearts. (Luke 12:49). in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that, by the mercies of God (Rom 12:1), you and your people will freely offer (Lev. 1:3, Lev. 22:29) your

bodies as a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God (Rom. 12:1), a sweet aroma to the Lord (Eph. 5:2, Lev. 1:17); to do good and to share (Heb.13:16) the bread of Christ (John 6:51); to give your life to serve and to follow Christ (John 12:26), for with such sacrifices God is well pleased (Heb. 13:16). Surely, you and your house will not allow the salt of the covenant of your God to be lacking (Lev. 2:13); and that you and your house shall be saturated with the oil of anointing (Is. 10:27), and fragrant with the frankincense of praise (Lev. 2:15, Heb. 13:15). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we beseech you to continue to offer the sacrifice of praise to God, the fruit of your lips, giving thanks to His name (Heb. 13:15); giving thanks that it pleased the Father that in Christ all the fullness should dwell, and by Christ to reconcile all things to Himself, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace with you through the blood of the cross (Col. 1:19-20). We ask, in the precious name of Jesus Christ, your Redeemer (Job 19:25), that having been justified by faith, you and your house have peace with God through your Lord Jesus Christ (Rom 5:1). Let you and your family enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name. For the Lord is good; His mercy is everlasting, and His truth endures to all generations. (Ps. 100:1-5) With gladness, both with thanksgivings and singing (Neh. 12:27), may you and your people praise in the gates of the Lord (2 Chr. 31:2). Let you and your people wash your hands with innocence, and go about His altar (Ps. 26:6), be planted in the house of the Lord (Ps. 92:13), love the habitation of His house, and the place where His glory dwells (Ps. 26:8), and flourish in the courts of your God (Ps. 92:13), that you may proclaim with the voice of thanksgiving (Ps. 26:7), and magnify Him with heart felt thanksgiving (Ps. 69:30).

Father, we thank You that You have heard us. (John 11:41) We know that You always hear us (John 11:42), and this is the confidence that we have in You, that if we ask anything according to Your will, You hear us. And if we know that You hear us, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of You (1 John 5:14-15). Therefore, we thank our God always concerning you and your people for the grace of God which is given to you by Christ Jesus, that you are enriched in everything by Him in all utterance and all knowledge, even as the testimony of Christ is confirmed in you, so that you come short in no gift, eagerly waiting for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will also confirm you to the end, that you may be blameless in the day of our

Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, by whom you and your house are called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Cor. 1:4-9). We thank our God through Jesus Christ for you all (Rom. 1:8), and we give thanks that your inward man is being renewed day by day (2 Cor. 4:16); that you are being transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you and your people may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God (Rom. 12:2); and that your bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, who you have from God and you are not your own (1 Cor. 6:19). But God be thanked that though you and yours were slaves to sin, yet you obeyed from the heart (Rom. 6:17), you became the temple of the living God (2 Cor 6:16), and the Spirit of God dwells in you (1 Cor 3:16). As God has said: "I will dwell in them and walk among them." Therefore, "I will be their God, and they shall be My people. Come out from among them and be separate. Do not touch what is unclean, and I will receive you. I will be a Father to you, and you shall be My sons and daughters," says the Lord Almighty. (2 Cor. 6:16-18) Truly, the glory of the Lord will fill the house of God (2 Chr. 5:14), for the temple of God is holy, which temple you are (1 Cor 3:17). Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift! (2 Cor. 9:15) Let you and your house thank your God and praise His glorious name (1 Chr. 29:13), for all things come from God, and of His own you have given to Him (1 Chr. 29:14). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house, His people and the sheep of His pasture, will give Him thanks forever; that you and your house will show forth His praise to all generations (Ps. 79:13).

Grace, favor (Luke 2:52), blessing to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We thank our God upon every remembrance of you (Phil. 1:3), for in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we have you in our heart (Phil. 1:7), and through prayer and supplication in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we make request for you with joy (Phil. 1:4), that you all are partakers with us of grace and that God who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ (Phil. 1:5-6). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that above all things you will put on love, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, and be thankful (Col. 3:14-15). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we press you to continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving. (Col. 4:2) Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom. (Col 3:16) As a chosen vessel of Jesus Christ (Acts 9:15), to bear His name, we ask, the God of love and peace (2 Cor. 13:11), in the name of His precious Son, Jesus Christ, He who

lives to make intercession for you (Heb. 7:25), to send the Word of God to you in power and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance (1 Thess. 1:5); and you receive the Word with joy of the Holy Spirit, becoming examples to all (1 Thess. 1:6-7) As you received **Christ Jesus** the Lord, in **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you will walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, abounding in it with thanksgiving. (Col. 2:6-7) Whatever you do in word or deed, may you do all in the name of the Lord **Jesus**, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. (Col. 3:17) In **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, that you do all to the glory of God. (1 Cor. 10:31) You are the Lord's, surely, you will observe the day to the Lord, eat to the Lord, giving God thanks (Rom. 14:6), and live to the Lord (Rom. 14:8). Light is sown for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart. Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous, and give thanks at the remembrance of His holy name! (Ps. 97:11-12).

But thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through our Lord **Jesus Christ**. (1 Cor. 15:57). In the name of **Jesus**, He who is counted worthy of more glory than Moses (Heb. 3:3), in **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we request, according to the good pleasure of His will (Eph. 1:5), the Lord to pour His Spirit on your descendants and His blessing on your offspring, they will spring up among the grass, like willows by the watercourses (Is. 44:3-4). In **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that your house will always fear the Lord, and the Lord's mercy be from everlasting to everlasting, His righteousness, (Ps. 103:17), His salvation (Is. 51:8), His everlasting kingdom, and His dominion from generation to generation (Dan. 4:3). May the Lord give you increase more and more, you and your children. May you be blessed by the Lord, who made heaven and earth. (Ps. 115:14-15) In **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we ask, in the name of **Jesus Christ**, the Son of the Highest (Luke 1:32), that God perfect that which concerns you and your house; for His mercy endures forever. In **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we ask, in the name of your precious Son, **Jesus Christ**, O Mighty God, do not forsake the works of Your hands. (Ps. 138-8) Your truth, O Lord, endures to all generations. (Ps. 100:5) In **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you will leave an inheritance to your children's children (Prov. 13:22), rich in the fullness of God and in love (Eph. 3: 17-19), also in the knowledge of our Lord **Christ Jesus** (Eph. 1:17 -19). May you and your offspring abide in God's covenant with Him (Ps. 59:21): in **Christ** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we petition the God of life (Ps. 42:8), in the name of **Christ Jesus**, your redeemer (Ps. 19:14), that His Spirit who is upon you, and His words which He puts in your

mouth, shall not depart from your mouth, nor from the mouth of your descendants, nor from the mouth of your descendants' descendants, from this time forevermore (Is. 59:21). For all things are for your sakes, that grace, having spread through the many, may cause thanksgiving to abound to the glory of God. (2 Cor. 4:15) In ***Christ*** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that out of your house shall proceed thanksgiving and the voice of those who make merry; that God shall multiply you, and you will not diminish; that He will also glorify you, and you shall not be small. Your children also shall be as before, established before God. (Jer 30:19-20) Great deliverance God gives to your house, and shows mercy to His anointed, and his descendants forevermore. (Ps. 18:50) Therefore, give thanks to God, our Lord, and sing praises to His name. (Ps. 18:49) In ***Christ*** (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house will offer to God thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High. (Ps. 50:14) To the end that your glory may sing praise to your Father (Ps. 30:12), the Lord of heaven and earth (Matt. 11:25), and not be silent. Surely, you and your house will give thanks to Him forever! (Ps. 30:12) Let you sing praise to the Lord, You saints of His (Ps. 30:4), sons and daughters of the Highest (Luke 0:4)36:35), and give thanks at the remembrance of His holy name (Ps. 30:4).

As a fellow worker for the Truth (3 John 1:8), abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), and one with Them (John 17:22), in truth (John 17:19) we sanctify (1 John 17:17,19, Heb. 13:12) you and your family, your time and your space, by the blood of the lamb (Rev. 7:14, 12:11). Our Lord and Savior (2 Pet. 1:11), ***Jesus Christ***, to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom the one which shall not be destroyed. The earth is the Lords, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein. (Ps. 24:1) The heavens are His, the earth also is His; the world and all its fullness, He has founded it. The north and the south, the east and the west, He has created it. For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. (Col. 1:16) You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created. (Rev. 4:11) As a fellow worker in ***Christ***, a fellow-worker of God (1 Cor. 3:9), abiding in Him, and born of Him (1 John 2:29), and His love being perfected in us (1

John 4:12), we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God. As a vessel of mercy, so that Christ might make known to you the riches of His glory, we claim you and all the people of the earth as the inheritance (Eph. 1:18) of our Lord Jesus Christ. By the Ancient of Days, judgment was made in favor of the saints of the Most High, and the time has come for the saints to possess the kingdom. (Dan. 7:22) Awake, you who sleep, arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light; awake to righteousness, and do not sin. And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is near. (Rom. 13:11) Come near, you nations, to hear; and heed, you people! Let the earth hear, and all that is in it, the world and all things that come forth from it. (Is. 34:1)

forever. (Matt. 6:13) Amen
