Growing Church Workshop and Open Forum

After Church, Sunday, February 11th

Dear Members and Friends,

Our church has decided to hold the February Growing Church Workshop (GCW) and Open Forum (OF) this coming Sunday afternoon, February 11th, following the church service, instead of on Monday evening, February 12th at 7:00 p.m., when it would be usually scheduled. Many were hoping that this change of time would encourage those who do not normally participate to do so since our church faces some major decisions.

The Pledge Letter that was sent out at the end of the last year has yielded about half the response it did last year. Last year, out of 104 members, we received 53 responses and pledges amounting to about \$6,300. This year out of 98 members, we received 38 responses and pledges of \$4,828.

Currently, our offsite members now equal half of our membership for the first time. We have 49 offsite and 49 local members of whom only 22 locally have agreed, thus far, to serve in some way during the coming year.

The challenge is to keep our services going, our reading room open during the hours we agreed upon 2 years ago, as well as other local activities. There is a need for people to step up and read at Sunday and Wednesday services, work in the Reading Room, help print the programs and serve as Hosts at our services. There is a crucial need for people to step up or alternate as Head Host. The Head Hostt opens and closes the church each Sunday morning. This has been faithfully done by one dear member for the last several years but she has indicated she's not able to continue doing so after this month.

We need to discuss the 2018 Budget and how comfortable we are with dipping into our savings each year. Last year, we used \$53,000. Based on our current pledges, this next year - to maintain the same budget - we would need to use about \$72,000 of our current \$180,000 savings in a CD. Our monthly expenses run between \$11,000 -12,000 of which \$5,163 is rent.

So as you can see, there are several pressing issues we need to face as a church family and we sincerely hope the change of meeting time will allow more members the opportunity to participate whether in the room, on the phone or via the internet. Update from Petals of Africa School in Kenya

A New Girls Dormitory!

Dear Friends of Petals,

The new school year has started, and there are some good things happening at Petals. Because of last year's excellent test scores and the new girls' dormitory, interest in the school is high. Enrollment now stands at 289 students with 24 orphans and 45 partial orphans.

New Girls Dormitory. The beautiful new girls dormitory is almost complete (see photos), and the school has purchased 10 new bunk beds to accommodate more girls. The dorm was made possible by a generous gift from the former Visalia, California Christian Science church, along with the support of another donor. The leadership at Petals has been very satisfied with the builder, and they are planning to use the same one for the waste disposal system. I'd like to add a note here about how vigilant the Chairman of the Petals Board has been in overseeing the finances and operations at Petals. Having a partner with integrity and vision and an understanding both of the local culture and Western expectations/norms has been essential and a huge blessing.

Advancing Students. Thank you so much to those of you who responded to our call for contributions to the Advancing Students fund. Because of you, all of the students were able to start secondary school. The Advancing Students committee at the school decided to split the available funds among the students who did not have sponsors. This meant that the students could start school on time, though it seemed very likely that many of them would eventually be sent home for not paying school fees. With a lot of gratitude, I can share that a donor has just recently pledged an amount that will enable the students to stay in school, with parents paying just a little bit to make up the difference. The orphans, of course, have been taken care of.

Teachers. Most of the teachers have returned, though there is a new Deputy Head Teacher, Okinyi Dishon. Okinyi has been at the school for many years and has become almost indispensable. He is an excellent teacher and administrator and a big support to Emily Akirapa, the Head Teacher. (Mr. Okinyi is the teacher largely responsible for the high math scores on the KCPE.) He is a faithful member of the CS Society and hopes to have class instruction this summer. Another big thank you to those of you who contribute regularly to help pay teacher salaries. This is still an important need. Paying the teachers on time has perhaps been the biggest factor in the success of Petals over the last few years. Computers and soccer balls. We were able to ship 11 used laptops to Petals so computer instruction will begin soon. A friend of the school also sent funds specifically for new soccer balls (see photo). Representatives from Principia visited in December and brought gifts of pencils, pens, balls, and t-shirts.
