

## **Members in Action**

Tower Takedown in Oakland, June 29, 2019

An Oakland, CA resident sought assistance in removing an antenna tower from the rear of her home. East Bay Hams responded.

This antenna tower takedown group represented six amateur radio groups in the East Bay: the East Bay Amateur Radio Club (EBARC), the Contra Costa Communications Club (4Cs), the Oakland Radio Communication Association (ORCA), the Berkeley CERT and Inter Neighborhood Network (BeCERTAINN), the Northern Alameda

The tower was about 45 feet high and had a further 4 feet of antenna structure. The base of the tower consisted of a steel rectangle



(mounted with four bolts to the concrete footing) and a triangular steel structure at the bottom of the tower. This piece was attached to

> the steel base with a pivot pin. The tower was mounted in a pivoting base that would allow it to be lowered intact and disassembled. The antenna spanned 23 feet and was mounted on a rotor. The tower, with its bottom three sections, extension on its topmost section, additional steel plates, and antenna section weighed approximately 200-225 lbs.

Jay, KJ6WSS, the foreman of this takedown operation, worked hard to evaluate the project and created a safe and effective plan for the tower's removal.



Jay created a pulley system to lower the tower. The lowering rope used a pulley at the edge of the roof. Another rope was attached to the chimney to provide guidance and support. That rope could also be used to re-raise the tower if



necessary. An additional rope extended downward and enabled the tower to move laterally, if required, to guide its descent. The lowering rope supported the entire weight of the tower as it descended.

Before the descent, the tower was detached from two attachment points to the house. The upper bracket was attached to the roof, and the lower bracket was attached to the side of the house.





The lowering took place by removing a pin at the rear of the base to release the tower for pivoting. The weight of the tower was now supported by the pivot at the base and by the lowering rope from above. Once the tower had cleared a roof obstruction, it was lowered toward a ladder set up to support the tower for disassembly.



The disassembly of the antenna sections required a series of rotations and section removals. Ultimately the entire antenna mast and rotor were removed prior to disassembling the tower itself. The tower was disassembled from the bottom section to the top, section by section. The remainder of the tower was slid toward the house as each section was removed.

welcome play with it.







It's about 10 ft long by 7.5 ft wide. A couple of the plastic fittings are broken but should be able to be superglued back into shape.
