

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

## Warrant

For Annual Plantation meeting year 1935  
To Joseph A. Stevens, a Constable in the State  
of Maine in the County of Lincoln greeting:

In the name of the state of Maine you are  
hereby required to notify and warn the In-  
habitants of the said St<sup>t</sup>e. qualified to vote in  
plantation affairs to assemble at the School-  
House in said plantation on Monday the  
11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1935 at one o'clock in the  
afternoon to act on the following articles to  
wit:

First. To choose a Moderator to preside at  
the said meeting.

Second. To choose a Plantation Clerk for the  
ensuing year.

Third. To listen to the reading of the Treas-  
urer's report and to act on the same.

Fourth. To choose a plantation Treasurer  
for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To choose all other necessary St<sup>t</sup>e.  
Officers for the ensuing year. Assessors,  
Constables, Collector of Taxes, and to vote  
his or her compensation. One member  
of School Committee, Truant Officer, Surveyor  
of Wood and Lumber, Board of Health  
and Fire Wards to be appointed by the  
Assessors.

Sixth. To see if the St<sup>t</sup>e. will vote to place  
the repairs of Roads in the hands of the  
municipal Officers. They to serve with-  
out pay except they be employed as  
actual laborers then to receive laborers pay.

Seventh. Should the preceding article not be  
adopted the St<sup>t</sup>e. will proceed to elect  
a Road Commissioner as the Law provides.

Eighth. To see if the St<sup>t</sup>e. will grant and raise  
such sums of money as may be neces-  
sary for the support of Schools, the Poor,  
repairs of Roads and Bridges, and to  
defray all other St<sup>t</sup>e. charges for the  
ensuing year.

Ninth. To see if the St<sup>t</sup>e. will vote to make  
a division in money raised for said

- road work, a part to be used for summer months and a certain part to be used for the removal of snow. Signed, Kate McElain  
 Ten. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will vote to raise a sum of money for the purchase of a suitable Snow and Road Drag for use on Roads.
- Eleven. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant and raise a sum of money and how much to defray the charges of a Superintendent of Schools.
- Twelve. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant and raise a sum of money necessary for printing ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> Reports.
- Thirteen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant and raise a sum of money and how much for Discounts and Statements.
- Fourteen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant a sum of and how much to be used for advertising the material resources, advantages, and attractions of the state of Maine.
- Fifteen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant and raise a sum of money to be used in repairs on Deacon walk if such should be needed.
- Sixteen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> vote to grant the Assessors authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes. Should it be necessary.
- Seventeen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will grant and raise a sum of money and how much to be expended for repairs on ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> Landing if the same should be needed.
- Eighteen. To see if the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> will vote a sum of money and how much to be expended in Island Cemetery when needed.
- Nineteen. Request of Dr John Cartot. Jan 22 - 1935  
 Board of Assessors, Monhegan Maine. Gentleman  
 I hereby request that the ~~St~~<sup>City</sup> of Monhegan take over the right of way from the main road to my residence and put it in condition to give access to my property.
