GFX Coverage: Seattle Named No. 1 Fleet Among 100 Best Fleets for 2012

June 20, 2012 Government Fleet

DENVER – The City of Seattle's Fleet Management Division (FMD) was named the No. 1 Fleet out of the 100 Best Fleets list for 2012 at Government Fleet Expo on Wednesday, June 20. Tom Johnson introduced the award ceremony for the 100 Best Fleets and Top 20 Fleets. The 2012 awards were sponsored by INVERS and Property Room. The 100 Best Fleets is organized by *Government Fleet* magazine in partnership with Tom Johnson.

During the ceremony, the 100 Best Fleets for 2012 were named and representatives from the fleets were called up to the stage to accept their award certificates. In addition, the Top 20 Fleets and their respective achievements were named. The Top 20 Fleets, and the 2012 Elite Fleets, are listed below.

During 2011 and previous years, Seattle's FMD made numerous investments in technology, from automating the City's motor pool, upgrading the City's fuel management software, and implementing purchasing and work order management modules after a major computer upgrade for the entire division, all in order to drive greater efficiencies.

The FMD conducted a fleet utilization study that resulted in millions of dollars in current and future cost savings from a reduced fleet size. Overall, the City eliminated 255 vehicles, trucks, and equipment in 2011. The division also identified an additional 17 fleet reductions in early 2012. Since 2009, the City has reduced its fleet size by 10 percent.

Training and education was a focus for FMD staff. Individuals invested heavily in education and training, earning fleet industry certifications, administrative and business certifications, and advanced degrees.

Also, through a grant from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), Seattle's FMD spearheaded the City's effort to install electric vehicle charging stations, installing 26 at the City's newly automated motor pool, and another 40 stations at public and City-owned sites. The City was also able to purchase 10 hybrid-electric trucks and 38 all-electric Nissan LEAF sedans. Of the LEAFs, 26 are set for the City's motor pool and the remaining 12 will go to 10 other City departments. So far, the motor pool's LEAFS have traveled more than 40,000 miles and have eliminated the need to purchase 800 gallons of petroleum fuel.

"I've had the good fortune to have a strong team that does [good] work," said Dave Seavey, director of the City of Seattle's fleet management division.
