

My Mustang (Joe Guy)

I custom ordered my car on 8 February 2001 from Phil Long Ford at Chapel Hills here in Colorado Springs, Colorado. I ordered it as "a GT with no options". In 2001, the GT came with the deluxe interior and Air Conditioning, so I am hardly "roughing it". I was able to buy it at dealer invoice, which at that time was \$20,801. The car arrived on 20 April 2001 with the desirable "K" transmission code (Tremec 3650 Trans) and it has not spent a night outside since.

I have added a few items to it, such as a 2003-2004 Mach 1 front spoiler, replica 18" Cobra 2000R wheels, and Eibach Pro-Kit Springs which lowered it 1 inch all the way around. Additionally, a Vortech Supercharger kit with the full STEEDA Q-400 tuning package, a Performance Products Typhoon 2-piece intake manifold and upper power elbow. Ceramic coated BBK long tube headers and catted H pipe are also found, with a MAC cat back exhaust with custom megaphone exhaust tips. Ford Motorsport 3.73 rear end gears, a McLeod pressure plate and clutch, a pillar mounted Auto Meter boost gauge, and Shelby style shift knob from CJ Pony Parts rounds out most of the work done.

Because of the deployments I was on in my military career, I was away most of the time, leaving the car covered and garaged. Thus, the car has just hit 3,100 miles. It is registered with the Yellow Mustang Registry, # 429, and is one of only 10,706 Mustangs factory painted in Zinc Yellow in 2001.

[At last year's dyno day at] at RMCR, the car put down 418 horsepower and 376 torque. With drivetrain loss, the power at the flywheel would, of course, be substantially higher. A Mustang Magazine took a car with the same engine setup (STEEDA Q-400) to 12.9 @ 111 in the ¼ mile and 0-60 in 4.9 seconds, so that kind of gives an idea how it runs. I would compare it to a 1969-70 BOSS 302 that has been warmed up a tad....low gears=high strung and quick to perform wheel spin. Thanks for taking the time to read and look at my ramblings about my 15 year old "new Mustang".....how did THAT happen?

Road to Hana (Hap Schadler)

[Editor's note: The **Hāna Highway** is a long stretch of Hawaii Routes 36 and 360 which connects Kahului with the town of Hāna in east Maui. Refer to this wikipedia link for additional information. <u>Hana Highway</u>]

Sara and I went to Maui in April and rented a Mustang convertible for the week we'd be on the island. Nice black car, but a word of advice is to get a lighter color or park well away from trees. The birds loved it and decorated it continuously. Small children would point and laugh at us as we went by. Of course they might have just been laughing at me.

On Easter Sunday we decided to take the drive to Hana and then return and have Easter dinner at Mama's Fish House on the East shore. Day was beautiful and clear and we never saw rain for the entire trip and back.

One bit of advice is to start early as most of the traffic will be going to Hana in the morning and returning in the afternoon. This is important as the road hugs the coastline pretty much the entire way and has 617 turns and 54 one lane bridges. Also unmentioned is that there is construction here and there on the road which is very narrow to begin with and results in a number of single lane sections which can go on for a while. The road is 52 miles long and probably aptly named the "Divorce Highway". Although Sara and I never argued the whole way there and back. She offered to drive, but I hogged the driving duties.

Do not trust the mile markers as they and the guidebooks do not match. We found them to be off by sometimes as much as a half a mile. Drive out was lovely and we made several stops for the lovely waterfalls and the black sand beach right before you get to Hana. Need to be aware of on coming drivers, especially locals who seem to try to time all the one lane sections. We had several cases of having to stop quick and back up to allow the oncoming driver to get by.


One lane bridges were really not that bad. Both sides had a stop section before the bridge and usually you had enough of a sight line to see if anyone was there or coming. Then just a matter of gunning it across. The one lane sections of road were the hairiest bits as sometimes the section went on for a while and pass sight lines or around corners. All you could do was gun the car if you didn't see anything and hope you didn't get half way before you saw someone coming in the other direction. This is a very narrow road as well with just enough room to get two opposing cars by. I found that I could judge where I was by if I could hear the car hitting the vines that grew over the guard rails. If I did I knew I had no more room.

Hana port and Hana town are both very small and do not have much in the way of facilities. Not really why you came out anyway. It was for the drive and scenery. Having seen what we were interested in on the way out we drove straight back to make our reservation for dinner. I made great time in that I completed the drive in an hour and a half. After we were sitting down to dinner I mentioned to Sara that the drive back was like an hour and a half autocross. She said she had had the same impression although it was nastier with the guard rails and oncoming traffic.

Club Clothing

A minimum order of 24 or more pieces in mixed styles, colors and sizes is required. In order to meet the minimum order quantity, the club accumulates individual member requests until the minimum quantity is met, then places an order. 
