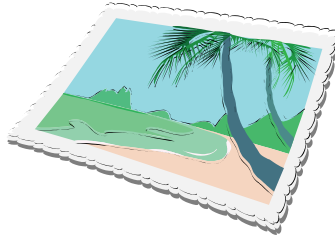

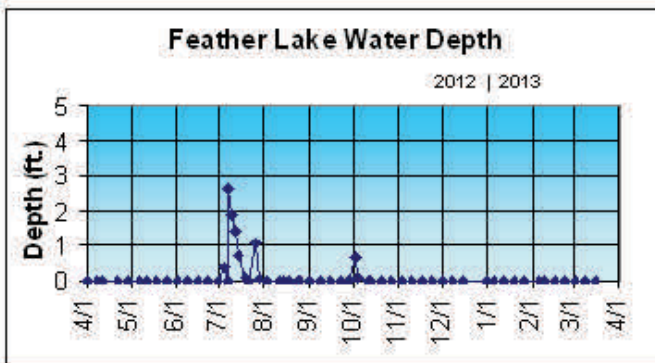

AT FEATHER LAKE

Feather Lake remains dry and closed to public use. It has now been almost 6 months since any water was in the basin. Feather Lake continues to experience the double whammy of 1) no rainfall to put surface runoff in the lake and 2) extensive regional groundwater pumping drawing down the water table. The water-table decline is hitting wetland and riparian habitats, which rely on a shallow water table, especially hard.

Our next workday at Feather Lake takes place **Sat., April 6** starting at **8 a.m.** We'll continue clearing downed trees from the trail on the inner berm within the basin.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

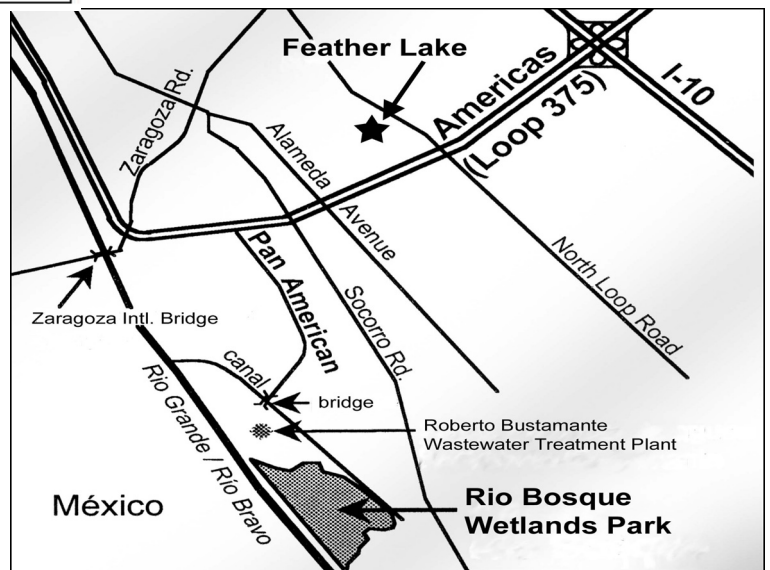

Notes From the Field

January 18th-21st, 2013 Phoenix and Maricopa County Area.

This was a new trip and we had a tremendous turnout of 21 people! We had perfect weather (after freezing temperatures the week before in Phoenix). We visited Boyce Thompson Arboretum, where we had a guided tour and saw lots of cactus from all over the world and it was very birdy there. We saw the Black-throated Gray Warbler and Gila Woodpecker there.

We had a great picnic under the trees with wonderful sandwiches that Fay and Kathy Millett brought. After lunch we went to Tres Rios Wetlands where we saw a large rookery of nesting Great Blue Herons. That was a treat! We also stopped by Encanto Park, which is a truly beautiful park. We were looking for the Rosy-faced



Lovebird. We had almost given up, but on the way out we saw several.

That evening we had a group dinner at The Landmark, a famous old Mormon Church. Early the next morning we went to Gilbert Water Ranch, the number one birding spot in the Phoenix Area. We were not disappointed. There we saw Bendire's Thrasher, Lawrence's Goldfinch, several people saw a Kestrel with his newly-caught prey, lots of water birds,

Marsh Wren, lots of Rosy-faced Lovebirds, lots of Verdin, Anna's Hummingbird and Costa's Hummingbird.

We then headed off to Buckeye, AZ, where we had lunch at a local restaurant that served Mexican and Greek food! Interesting combination, but the food was actually quite good. We then went to the famous Thrasher spot, where we had fleeting looks at Le Conte's Thrasher and good looks at lots of Sage Sparrows. Monday morning we had a guided bird walk with Diana Herron at the Desert Botanical Garden. We had good looks at Northern Cardinal, Gilded Flicker, Western Screech-Owl, Great Horned Owls, Cactus Wren, Costa's and Anna's hummingbirds, and Zone-tailed Hawk.



Fay and Kathy Millett were instrumental in helping us plan and lead the trip. Thanks to everyone in the group for making this such a memorable trip.

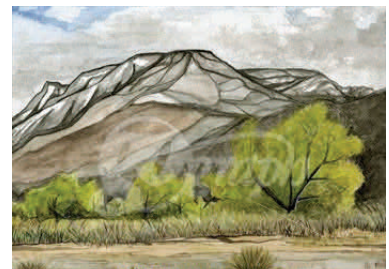
Sierra Vista, AZ, Memorial Day Weekend, May 24-27, 2013.

Let's "Fly" into Action! Audubon's Birdathon 2013!

Birdathon counters are already "in training" in preparation for Birdathon 2013.
It all takes place May 4-5.

What is Birdathon, you might ask?

One thing is for sure, it's not your average bird count or fund raiser! Birdathon is unusual and different: a wild weekend of birding and our organization's most important source of income for conservation and education programs.

We hope you can join us for a full, rewarding weekend of birding by being a **sponsor** and possibly even a counter (if you want to become part of the "Birdathon Flock" as a counter, please contact Jane Fowler at 598-2448 or Janet Perkins at 581-2849).

Birdathon 2013 will benefit the following programs and projects:

CHAPTER OPERATIONS & FEATHER LAKE WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

Scouts, students and adults can enjoy seeing birds up close in a natural habitat. When the lake has water, we have docents on duty to answer questions, provide printed trail guides & lend binoculars.

RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK

Each year, this site along the Rio Grande becomes more valuable as habitat for birds and other wildlife.

AUDUBON TEXAS

Our support helps keep National Audubon's state office an effective voice for birds, other wildlife and their habitats in Texas.

How Birdathon Works

On the weekend of **May 4-5**, our dedicated Birdathon counters will be busy scouring the countryside, trying to find as many bird species as possible, in a single 24-hour blitz. These hardy, energized and intrepid individuals will start early, stay out late, visit varied wildlife habitats and give their eyes, ears and bird knowledge a full workout. Why do they push themselves so hard? For the pleasure of a day in the field, for a test of their birding skills and **most importantly, for a better West Texas environment.**

Each counter will be backed by sponsors who pledge either a given amount for each species seen or a fixed total amount. Most counters will identify 50 to 100 species. A pledge of, say \$0.50 per species for 60 species would result in a contribution of \$30. 95% of Birdathon income goes to the programs and projects; 5% to fundraising (printing, paper and postage).

Looking for someone to sponsor for Birdathon? This year's outstanding counters are a dedicated bunch, most of whom are experienced Birdathoners.
